4-H Gardening Curriculum Cultivates Green Thumbs

Are you aware that 4-H has a gardening curriculum called Junior Master Gardener? It's not really surprising since 4-H offers something to pique the interest of nearly any club member

Junior Master Gardener is a very versatile curriculum that can be used for 4-H groups, as well as camps, classrooms and any other group of youth, said Shelley Mitchell, associate specialist with Oklahoma State University Extension and the Oklahoma 4-H Youth Development program.

"There are two levels of Junior Master Gardener. The level one curriculum is geared for students in grades 3 through 5, while level two is geared for grades 6 through 8. Activities in both levels can be modified to suit basically any age," Mitchell said. "This program is a great way to grow good kids by igniting a passion for learning, success and service through gardening education."

The basic level one curriculum is divided into a teacher's/volunteer leader's guide and a student handbook. All the curriculum is research and evidence-based. The activities in the student handbook are written to be done by students on their own.

The teacher/volunteer leader guide has most of the group activities. Activities are organized by topic: water, soil, fruits, vegetables, insects, plant growth and development, ecology, landscape horticulture, and life skills and career exploration. Materials needed for activities are common and easy to find, such as paper plates, old socks and ties, gallon jugs, and basic school and art supplies.

Mitchell said participants who do 12 activities from a single chapter, as well as a life skill activity and a community service project, will become "Golden Ray Certified." If participants do this for each topic in the guide, they will become a certified Junior Master Gardener. Certificates and pins are available to celebrate accomplishments.

"It's fairly easy to become a Junior Master Gardener group. You'll need at least five youth and an adult leader. You can register as a group online," she said. "What makes this really easy is that there's no training necessary to lead a Junior Master Gardener Group, but trainings are available to introduce leaders to different activities in the curriculum.

In addition to the levels one and two basic curricula, there are curricula focused on one area. Wildlife Gardener has chapters on birds, amphibians, small mammals and other garden visitors. Literature in the Garden uses six books available at any bookstore and has activities designed to go along with each book. The newest curriculum, Learn, Grow, Eat and Go! is a 10-week program devoted to healthy eating and exercise. Students learn how to start a garden and are introduced to new foods each week.

"All of the activities are garden related, and the program can be used in any way you need to fit the goals of your club. You can order the curriculum and just do a few activities with a group of youth, register a group and work toward certification, supplement lessons in your classroom or use it to fulfill requirements for scout badges," Mitchell said. "There are so many options."

The website for Junior Master Gardener has free sample lessons, giveaways, online learning modules, lists of activities linked to Texas Education Standards, a Kid Zone and a store, along with basic information about the program.
