Exhibitors must reside in Beaver County; be attending school in Beaver County and be in FFA or 4H; or be a tax-payer to the General Fund.

The Fair Board Inc. or any of the officers shall not be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury of any kind to any property while under their control or at any time or place. YOU WILL BE RE-POSNIBLE TO GOVERN YOUR-SELVES. THE FAIR BOARD WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR HEALTH AND SAFETY. WE JUST URGE YOU TO BE RESPOSIBLE, USE COMMON SENSE, AND FOLLOW THE CDC GUIDELINES AS CLOSE AS POSSIBLE, SUCH AS HAND WASHING, SANITIZING, ETC...

If property owner desires protection against loss, damage or injury from fire or other causes, they must make own arrangements.

Exhibitors will not be allowed to remove any exhibit, article or animal until the designated time. Release time for Exhibits is Saturday after 4:00pm.

Vouchers will not be distributed on the closing day of the fair. All Exhibitors are requested to submit a self addressed stamped letter sized envelope at time of entry.

The Fair Association reserves the right to pay all premiums pro rata if the proceeds of the Association are not sufficient to pay all the premiums in full.

#### **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

The Board of Managers has the right to settle all questions arising. Any person who violates any general rule will forfeit premiums.

The Fair Board uses a computer program which is compatible with the State Fair for entries. We recommend that all entries be pre-entered by NOON on Thursday, September 8<sup>th</sup> this will be greatly appreciated. Entry tags will be available from department superintendents or at the OSU Extension Center as soon as items are pre-entered. Entries the day of the show will have to submit an entry sheet and should expect to hand fill in entry tags.

All articles must be owned or grown during the current year.

Where there is only one entry, it will be placed as first **only if it is worthy** of first place. Premiums will not be awarded to unworthy exhibits.

No more than one entry in each class except in the Livestock and classes which state more than one entry.

All livestock must be owned by exhibitor 30 days prior to the Fair and fed on home premises or school farm.

No animal will be allowed to be entered in the name of any person other than the owner. Any false statement in regard to any animal or article will result in exclusion from all competition. No diseased animals will be permitted to exhibit.

- 2.Each entry must be prepared and baked by the person whose name is on the entry form.
- 3.The same person MAY NOT win Champion, Reserve Champion or Bread Machine Class. Two separate people should win, unless entries do not offer that selection

#### (Duplicate recipes may not be entered by different family members in any class or division.)

4.The recipe must accompany entry at county and state level. Entries that are eligible to compete at state level will provide 2 copies of the recipe—one at county fair (which will be mailed to Commission office by County Extension Educator) and bring one with entry at state competition. 5.Whole Wheat Bread Class #2—This category will include only the use of whole wheat flour and/or a whole white wheat flour. NO All-purpose or Bread Flour included in this category. Dough enhancers, vital wheat gluten and whole grains, in addition to whole wheat, are permissible. 6. Dinner rolls should consist of three (3)

rolls per entry. Any shape acceptable.

7. The OTHER WHEAT BREADS, class #'s

- 4 and 9 will include other breads made with yeast such as cheese, French, onion, sourdough, challah, focaccia, etc. **NO QUICK BREADS** unless yeast is used as a leavening agent. (All breads must use yeast as a leavening agent.)
- 8.Class 11 Specialty Shapes Let your imagination go: animals, people, objects, etc. All garnishes must be edible.

## Twists and star breads should be entered in the "other wheat breads" or "sweet breads" category and not specialty shapes class.

- 9. "Best of Wheat" formerly Wheathearts, sponsored Bread Baking Contest is to be judged separately from the county fair open class division.
- 10. County Champion and Reserve Champion from each division are eligible for state competition (see exception below) at the State Fair of Oklahoma on September 25, 2022.
- 11.One (1) Bread Machine entry from each division, class #'s 6 and 12, determined by county judge, will be eligible for competition at state level. Bread machine entries will not be eligible for County Champion or Reserve Champion at county level or eligible for Grand Champion at State level or silver tray award. First through 5th place ribbons will be awarded to the bread machine class in both divisions at the state competition. If any part of the recipe is done with a bread machine, then the recipe will be classified in the bread machine category.

Dehorning of goats is not suggested; however horns should be tipped and rounded. Artificial coloring, paint and powder are not permitted. Goats must be sheared to a maximum of 3/8" residual hair length. The animals must have all four feet on the ground. Animals must be shown with a collar used only to control the animal. Exhibitor can only transiently touch the animal with his body. Exhibitor cannot use the collar to make the animal tense his muscles. Any animal with abscesses will NOT be allowed to remain on the fairgrounds. Goats must be free from external parasites, ringworm and warts. The use of hydration utensils and the use of soft muzzles are permitted in the stalls only.
