BEAVER COUNTY SPEECH CONTEST

Presentations will begin at 6 PM.

All contestants will need to be present no later than 6:30pm. Divisions are by age as of September 1, 2023:

JUNIOR: 3rd (8 years old); 4th & 5th Grades; INTERMEDIATE: 6th–8th; SENIOR: 9th-12th Grades.

<u>Speeches—Illustrated or non-illustrated</u>— A 4-H speech is one means of sharing information and educating an audience about a specific subject. It is an oral presentation in which the member may use posters/illustrations or objects to emphasize/illustrate specific points in the speech. A member <u>does not</u> actually make or demonstrate how to do something in an illustrated talk. No PPT presentations/slides in this division. Time lengths for Speeches are: Junior—3 to 5 minutes, Intermediate and Senior—5-12 minutes.

<u>PowerPoint Presentation</u>—PPT slides replace posters and the presenter is demonstrating the skills they have mastered when integrating technology into a speech/presentation. Members will be evaluated on their ability to design and create the PPT slides which complement the oral content of the presentation. The PPT should not be the "presentation". **Time lengths for Power-Points are: Junior—3-5 minutes, Intermediate and Senior—5 to 7 minutes.**

<u>Video Presentation</u>—Videos are due to the Extension Office by Tuesday, **April 11, 2024, 5pm.** Videos <u>should be</u> submitted on a flash drive or contact the office for instructions for uploading to U-tube. The video must be a speech as though given in front of an audience <u>without any editing.</u> <u>cropping, etc.</u> Time lengths for Video Presentation are: JR—3-5 min., Int. & SR 5-7 min.

<u>Impromptu</u>— Will draw a topic and will have a few minutes to prepare a speech on the topic provided.; for fun, no points or awards given.

RESEARCH NOTED THE POSITIVE IMPACTS OF 4-H PROGRAMMING
"The 4 H Study of Positive Youth Development," has been a tremendous asset for the 4 H system and helped us tell a powerful story nationally and locally. 4-H Council recently funded a follow-up study to replicate the research with new youth, as well as reconnect with the original study participants, who are now adults. This <u>Replication and Reconnection Study</u> confirms the original, powerful outcomes that 4 H helps youth thrive in the present and into adulthood. Here are some key findings:

Compared to their peers, 4 H participants are:

- •4x more likely to make a positive contribution to their communities
- •2x more likely to participate in out-of-school science programs
- •2x more likely to make healthier choices
- •2x more likely to report feeling competent
- •2x more likely to feel positive about their wellbeing

4-H alumni are:

- •3x more likely to participate in community service
- •2x more likely to report living life with intentionality and purpose
- •2x more likely to have the goal of being a leader

SPECIAL 4-H PROJECT AWARDS

Members are eligible to receive the following Special County Awards listed below. To receive these awards a member must turn in a 4-H folder for each of the awards they are applying for by June 15th to the Beaver County Extension Office. This folder must include a short handwritten story on what the member completed and accomplished for the year in qualifying to receive the award.

These pages for award must also be included: Objective of Project, Work Done in Project, New Things Learned in Project, Expenses/Income for Project, and Picture Pages with captions for each picture. If more members allowed apply for an award, the 4-H member who has done the most presentations, work, etc. towards the award will receive the award. Awards will be presented at the 4-H banquet.

Following are the guidelines for each award:

JUNIOR BREADS— Must not have passed 13th birthday by January 1 of the program year; demonstrations and/or illustrated speeches at the county 4-H contests

Members are eligible to receive the following Special County and slisted below. To receive these awards a member must of the program year; demonstrations and/or illustrated speeches at the county 4-H contests

DAIRY PRESENTATION—May submit one team and one individual; give an individual and a team dairy demonstration and/or illustrated speeches at the county 4-H contests

PEANUT PRESENTATION—May submit one team or two individuals; individual demonstrations and/or illustrated talks related to peanut production, processing, marketing, or food recipes utilizing peanuts or peanut products at the county 4-H contests.

PORK PROMOTION— May submit one award per county; Jr. 3-7th Grade; Sr. 8-12th Grade; presents a pork related talk or demonstration at the county 4-H contests <u>and</u> to a non-4-H group.

WATER CONSERVATION—May submit one award per county; individual demonstration, talk or power point at one of the county contests on Water Conservation, Protection or Utilization
