DELEGATES: Delegates should be in the seventh (7th) grade. They must be enrolled and in active status in 4-H to attend the Conference. Delegates will be allowed to vote in the District Officer election process.

COST: The Conference fee will be \$125.00 per youth (4 per room) If youth prefer two to a room the fee will be \$200.00 per youth. The Conference fee for Educators/chaperones will be \$200.00 per adult. The fee includes lodging. conference costs, pizza on Wednesday evening, breakfast, lunch and dinner on Thursday, and breakfast on Friday morning. T-shirts will cost \$12.00 each. Registration forms and Payment are due by September 9, 2025, at 4PM to the Beaver Co. Extension Office.

CONFERENCE LOCATION: The delegation will be staying at the Delta Hotels by Marriott Midwest City at the Reed Conference Center, 5750 Will Rogers Road, Midwest City, OK. The Conference will be held at the same location.

4-H FUN NIGHT /FOOD SHOW /PAINTED PUMPKIN CONTEST

- You are invited to 4-H Fun at the Fairgrounds on October 20 from 6 to 8pm.
- Doors open at 6:00pm
- Food Show entries by 6:20pm
- Pumpkins in place by 6:30pm
- Parent Session (Intro to 4-H, Shooting Sports, Record Books and Fairs etc.).
- Judging will begin at 6:30pm.
- While the two Contests are being judged, Fun Activities are planned for 4-H Families in the meantime.
- Skill-a-thons, games, a parent break-out session, and more will happen. A light supper will be served.

PAINTED PUMPKIN CONTEST

- Bring decorated pumpkins to the fairgrounds, doors will open at 6:00pm.
- Judging will begin at 6:30pm.
- One decorated pumpkin per 4-H member.
- Requirements are design must include a 4-H CLOVER on the pumpkin.
- No carving or piercing the pumpkin service is allowed (this extends the life of the pumpkin). Same grade divisions as the food show. Pumpkins left after 8pm will be distributed in town.

4-H FOOD SHOW

Monday, October 20, 2025 Beaver County Fairgrounds 6:20 PM ALL FOOD ITEMS TO BE IN PLACE JUDGING AT 6:30 PM

Food Exhibits are to be made from scratch; *no box mixes* allowed Except for decorated categories. Please provide recipes. Food items should be on a paper plate or sturdy base in a plastic bag when possible.

Contestant's Name needs to be on the bottom of the plate.

1st, 2nd, and 3rd place ribbons and premiums will be given in each class.

The Sweepstakes Award is given in each of the following divisions: Junior, Intermediate, and Senior. Sweepstakes is determined by points earned from items entered. The prize money for this contest is donated by Beaver County OHCE. Home canned food entries to be presented in standard jars made for home canning, with a raised pattern or lettering, clear, uncoloured glass and two-piece lids. Jar rings should be left on for display.

*Poster Category: Educational poster based on food or kitchen safety. Entry counts in the sweepstakes tabulations. Posters must be new for this contest, dated in permanent marker on the back. *These posters must not have been entered in the fair or previous contests.* Each poster will receive a ribbon but no premium money in the food show.

- Drink Mix

JUNIOR (3rd (8 yrs. old*), 4th & 5th) of *Sept 1, 2025)

Participants may enter any or all of the following classes:

- Muffins (3)
- Rolled Biscuits (3)
- Baked Dropped Cookies (3) No shaped cookies such as snickerdoodle or peanut butter.
- Decorated Cookies (3) (Judged on Decoration only)
- Jam or Jelly (1/2 or 1 pint jar, boiling water canner processed)
- Salsa/Picante Sauce (1 pint or 1/2 pint jar)
- Educational poster based on breads or cheeses of another country or countries.
- Educational poster based on recipe modification for healthful eating
- Educational poster based on food or kitchen safety
- Educational poster illustrating a place setting for a specific occasion or menu
- Bicycle Poster Create a poster on one of the following: a) bicycle safety b) bicycling as part of healthy living c) maintenance of bicycles.

INTERMEDIATE (6th-8th Grades as of Sept 1, 2025)

Participants may enter any or all of the following classes:

- One (1) half loaf of any yeast bread (not a sweet dough) made by hand or in a bread machine
- ❖ Three (3) yeast cinnamon rolls (no icing)
- Three (3) rolled sugar-type cookies (no icing; no gingerbread recipes)
- ❖ One (1) pint jar cucumber pickles
- ❖ One (1) pint or quart of any single canned fruit (not pickled)
- ❖ Dried Fruit (½ c of a single dried fruit) in sealed plastic bag
- ❖ A new, educational poster on protein food safety*
- ❖ Educational poster based on the nutritional contributions of

fruits and vegetables

- Educational poster based on the foods from another culture. Can be based on a cultural celebration.
- Educational display based on a breakfast bread buffet theme. Should include menu, buffet layout, decorations, invitations, and any additional information
- Bicycle Poster Create a poster on one of the following: a) bicycle safety b) bicycling as part of healthy living c) maintenance of bicycles.
- ❖ Decorated cupcakes (3 or more) Judged on decorations only.

SENIOR (9th-12th Grades as of Sept 1, 2025)

Participants may enter any or all of the following classes:

- \Box One-half loaf or portion of breads from another culture. Include a one (1) page story on how this bread fits into that culture and its nutritional contribution
- $\hfill\Box$ One-half of one 8" or 9" layer un-iced shorten type cake (no angel food or chiffon)
- \square Two-crust fruit pie -9" or 10" disposable pie pan. Crust and filling must be made by exhibitor.
- ☐ One (1) quart or one (1) pint jar of plain canned tomatoes
- ☐ Dried Vegetable (½ cup of a single dried vegetable). Display in a sealed plastic sandwich/freezer bag
- $\hfill \Box$ Educational poster based on the foods from another culture. Can be based on a cultural celebration.
- $\hfill \square$ Educational display based on a recipe modification to include:

Original recipe and what modifications were made

Benefits of the modifications

How did the modifications impact the above factors?

What were other people's responses to the modifications?

Registration is due at the Extension office by Thursday, Nov. 20nd.

Divisions as of September 1, 2025, are: Junior-3rd (8 yrs. old), 4th & 5th Grades; Intermediate-6th-8th Grades; Senior-9th-12th Grades.

- Length of act: maximum of six minutes on stage. Total time allowed: ten minutes (6 minutes on stage and a maximum total of 4 minutes to set-up (2 min.) and remove props (2 min.).
- Appropriateness of Act: All acts must support the positive values that underlie the 4-H Program. Acts should reinforce family values and MUST NOT include:
- Inappropriate or suggestive lyrics; Inappropriate or suggestive gestures
- Dress or costumes that are suggestive or provocative
- Topics that may offend diverse audiences or other groups
- Topics that glamorize alcohol, drugs, violence or other illegal or immoral behaviour.
- Acts deemed inappropriate after being performed will not be considered for placing.
