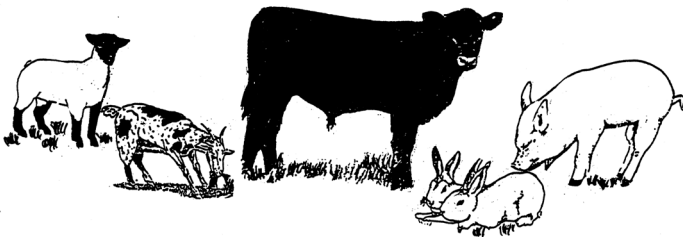

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Board of Managers has the right to settle all questions arising. Any person who violates any general rule will forfeit premiums.

The Fair Board uses a computer program which is compatible with the State Fair for entries. We recommend that all entries be pre-entered on line by 4pm on TUESDAY August 20th. Entry tags will be available at the OSU Extension Center. Wednesday entries can will be at the Fairgrounds at 3pm (you may have to wait in line to receive them).

No more than 3 entries per variety in each class except in the Livestock .
EXAMPLE: BEANS - STRING, YELLOW, ITALIAN

All articles must be owned or grown during the current year (since the last fair). Where there is only one entry, it will be placed as first only if it is worthy of first place. Premiums will not be awarded to unworthy exhibits. Items taken early may forfeit premiums.

All livestock must be owned by exhibitor 30 days prior to the Fair and fed on home premises or school farm.

No animal will be allowed to be entered in the name of any person other than the owner. Any false statement in regard to any animal or article will result in exclusion from all competition. No diseased animals will be permitted to exhibit.

**2023 STATE "BEST OF WHEAT"
BREAD BAKING CONTEST**

1. County Champion & Reserve Champion winners (excluding bread machine class) will receive awards from the Oklahoma Wheat Commission. Premiums will be provided only if the individual county does so.
2. **Recipes winning first place at the 2022 State contest are ineligible to be used in the 2023 contest.**
3. Each entry must be prepared and baked by the person whose name is on the entry form, with phone numbers submitted on the entry forms.
4. The same person MAY NOT win Champion, Reserve Champion or Bread Machine Class. Two separate people should win unless entries do not offer that selection. (Duplicate recipes may not be entered by different family members in any class or division.) the recipe must accompany entry at county and state level. Entries that are eligible to compete at state level will provide 2 copies of the recipe—one at county fair (which will be mailed to Commission office by County Extension Educator) and bring one with entry at the state competition.
5. Whole Wheat Bread Class #2—This category will include only the use of whole wheat flour and/or a whole white wheat flour. **NO** All-purpose or Bread flour included in this category. Dough enhancers,

vital wheat gluten and whole grains, in addition to whole wheat, are permissible.

6. Dinner rolls should consist of three (3) rolls per entry. Any shape acceptable.
7. The OTHER WHEAT BREADS, class #'s 4 & 9 will include other breads made with yeast such as cheese, French, onion, sour-dough, challah, focaccia, etc. **NO QUICK BREADS** unless yeast is used as a leavening agent. (All breads must use yeast as a leavening agent.)
8. Specialty Shapes Class # 11—Let your imagination go: animals, people, objects, etc. **All garnishes must be edible. Twists and star breads should be entered in the "other wheat breads" or "sweet breads" category & not specialty shapes class.**
9. **submitted recipes need to state what type of flour is utilized, meaning brand and classification, whether whole wheat, bread, all-purpose, hard red or white flour. For publication purposes brand of yeast and whether it is active or instant should also be specified.**

10. The "Best of Wheat", sponsored Bread Baking Contest is to be judged separately from the county fair open class division. County Champion and Reserve Champion from each division are eligible for state competition (see exception below) at the State Fair of Oklahoma on September 24, 2023.

11. One (1) Bread Machine entry from each division, class #'s 6 & 12, determined by county judge, will be eligible for competition at state level. Bread machine entries will not be eligible for County Champion or Reserve Champion at county level or eligible for Grand Champion at State level or silver tray award. First through 5th place ribbons will be awarded to the breads machine class in both divisions at the state competition. If any part of the recipe is done with a bread machine, then the recipe will be classified in the bread machine category.

7. When animals are not of sufficient merit, second or third, no premium will be awarded at the discretion of the judge.
8. All steers, barrows, wether lambs, and

wether goats must be owned by the exhibitor for 30 days prior to the opening day of the Fair.

9. All animals that are to be shown, must be owned and continuously fed on the home premises or approved school farm by the exhibitor.

Dehorning of goats is not suggested; however horns should be tipped and rounded. Artificial coloring, paint and powder are not permitted. Goats must be sheared to a maximum of 3/8" residual hair length. The animals must have all four feet on the ground. Animals must be shown with a collar used only to control the animal. Exhibitor can only transiently touch the animal with his body. Exhibitor cannot use the collar to make the animal tense his muscles. Any animal with abscesses will NOT be allowed to remain on the fairgrounds. Goats must be free from external parasites, ringworm and warts. The use of hydration utensils and the use of soft muzzles are permitted in the stalls only.
