Oklahoma 4-H Converging on Youth Mental Health and Wellness

While the Oklahoma 4-H Youth Development program plays a vital role in the development of a club member as a whole, one area they are focusing on more lately is youth mental health.

Health is an important part of 4-H, along with head, heart and hands. It's important enough to dedicate an entire H to it, said Cathy Allen, 4-H curriculum coordinator at the State 4-H Office at Oklahoma State University.

"In 4-H, we focus on all aspects of health, including nutrition, exercise and avoiding unhealthy choices such as smoking or vaping. However, mental health is becoming even more important because of the way it affects all aspects of healthy living," Allen said. "Positive mental function helps young people be productive, enjoy relationships and cope with change and adversity."

Youth mental health is an important issue not only in Oklahoma, but around the country and the world. Teens today are facing challenges all the time. Not only can school be stressful, but juggling a job, preparing for college entrance tests, bullying, racial tensions, depression, anxiety and poverty are just a few of the extra stressors youth may be dealing with.

"Then we add in the stress of the worldwide pandemic and it seems challenges have been exacerbated for today's youth," she said. "Online learning and feeling isolated are just a couple of things teens have had to deal with."

So, what exactly is mental health? When a person feels physically ill, the recovery steps typically are pretty straightforward – take over-the-counter medication, schedule a visit with a physician and rest are keys to recovery. It's the same for mental health. The key is to seek help.

Allen said the 4-H Healthy Living Ambassadors have recognized the importance of mental health and have incorporated stress management and journaling activities into Everyday Healthy Habits. Allen has given presentations to volunteer 4-H leaders to create awareness of warning signs and needs of youth.

"This group of ambassadors realize mental health is a primary challenge for today's teens and know the importance of sharing information with caring adult leaders who can then share it with club members," she said. "That's another great benefit of being involved in 4-H. Programs are designed to have club members and caring adults working side by side to develop life skills. This is beneficial for both the youth and the adults, too. This type of interaction provides 4-H'ers a place where they feel safe to talk about their emotions and their stresses."

Allen will be presenting more information about youth and mental health at the State 4-H Parent-Volunteer Conference in Stillwater, Oklahoma, in June.

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
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TRACTOR SAFETY TRAINING
