Entry Requirements

- Check the appropriate division box on the entry form
- Complete the narration script for modeling
- Entries due April 1, 2024.

Objectives

- Develop leadership abilities by demonstrating maturity, dependability, and responsibility.
- Exhibit skill in selecting appropriate fabric, patterns, and notions to construct a garment that meets high-quality standards.
- Become aware of appropriate accessories, good posture, and grooming habits while using that knowledge to display poise and neatness in appearance.

Guidelines

1. Youth will be judged in beginner, intermediate, and advanced 4-H divisions. Cloverbuds will participate in an exhibition format.
2. Entries will be judged on the State 4-H Roundup Modeling/presentation scoresheet. Intermediate and Advanced entries should include construction plans in their narration to prepare for Roundup and Fabrics and Fashion fair entries.
3. Garments exhibited in the Fashion Revue should meet state fair guidelines.
4. Fashion Revue entries will receive two scores:
Modeling/presentation evaluation - 80% Narration and construction plans – 20%
5. Participants may wear accessories, such as hand-made or ready-to-wear sweaters and blouses when they are part of a two- or three-piece suit.
6. Contestants should only wear garments that could be constructed per state fair guidelines. For example, an entry may enter a blazer and pants OR skirt, NOT a blazer, pants, and skirt.
7. Garments worn to school, church, and recreational activities are appropriate Fashion Revue entries.

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Narration

At the State 4-H Roundup competition, entries are required to model articles of clothing constructed according to their appropriate age and division as described in Section (4)306 of the Oklahoma State Fair Book. For the Canadian County Competition, construction is optional. Entries should select their dress and prepare a short narrative explaining the type of clothing worn, and the reason for wearing it. Judges should consider a higher score if plans are provided for constructing clothing that could be worn at the State 4-H Roundup Competition.

Cloverbuds are not required to provide a narration, but come prepared to talk about the clothing selected for the exhibition.

Awards

1. According to the number of entries, the Top Placing Individuals (based on scores) will be recognized with top honors and will receive a personalized award (max 5 per division). All contestants will be judged on a Danish Scoring System. All Cloverbuds will receive a participation award.
2. Eligible entries receiving honors will be invited to compete at the State 4-H Roundup Fashion Revue Competition
