4-H'ers Gear Up for Leadership Development

Oklahoma 4-H'ers have the opportunity to hone their leadership skills, learn new things, engage in community service, make new friends and have fun at the upcoming leadership conferences slated in all three districts.

Southeast District

The Southeast District Leadership Conference is slated for Oct. 16-18 at the Ardmore Convention Center. The conference is open to club members in 7th through 12th grade who are interested in beefing up their leadership skills. This year's theme is Leading Through the Storm.

"Our fall leadership conference will provide club members an opportunity to sharpen their skills as leaders," said Sara Randolph, Southeast District 4-H program specialist. "In addition to leadership-focused workshops, the conference attendees will participate in various community and civic engagement activities."

Participants will have a chance to meet other 4-H enthusiasts from around the district and learn great information to take back home to their local clubs. New district officers will also be elected.

Registration is \$125 and due Sept. 5 For more information, contact your county 4-H Youth Development educator.

Northeast District

Oklahoma 4-H'ers from the Northeast District will gather at the Fin and Feather Resort in Gore, Oklahoma, for their conference slated Oct. 16-18 and open to 7th through 12th grade 4-H'ers. The theme is 4-H Is My Superpower.

"Developing leadership skills is always a part of 4-H, and we'll focus on that this year. We're also planning a fun community service project of bringing school supplies that can be donated to area schools in need," said Leslie Lewis, Northeast District 4-H program specialist. "Our district club members will stay active at this conference with activities such as roller skating, bingo and a sports tournament."

The group will also hear from several guest speakers and elect the 2024-2025 Northeast District officers

Registration is \$125 and due by Sept. 6. Contact your local 4-H educator for more information about this conference.

West District

West District 4-H'ers are gearing up for two days of fun and learning at their leadership conference slated for Oct. 16-18 in Oklahoma City. The theme is Blazing the Leadership Trail!

"Financial literacy is an important life skill and this year's conference

will feature workshops geared toward making wise financial choices," said Jim Rhodes, West District 4-H program specialist. "The conference also provides opportunities to work on public speaking skills and several club members will present a citizenship project fair share."

Motivational and leadership speaker Aaron Alejandro will be on hand to share information with 4-H'ers, and the group will also elect their 2024-2025 district officers.

Registration is \$115 and due to the West District office by Sept. 16. County deadlines vary by office, so be sure to check with the local 4-H office in order to meet the deadline.


