104th State 4-H Roundup: Lights, Camera, Action, 4-H!

Plans are underway for the 104th State 4-H Roundup and delegates from around the state will come together to celebrate accomplishments, make new friends and create memories that will last a lifetime. This year's Roundup will take place July 23-25.

Roundup is the culmination of the 4-H year, and as with years' past, there's much to be celebrated this year, said Cathy Allen, 4-H curriculum coordinator at the state 4-H office at Oklahoma State University.

"Roundup is an opportunity to come to the OSU campus, engage in educational workshops, make new friends, catch up with old friends and compete in state contests," Allen said.

With a sidewalk chalk competition, campaign speeches, district rallies, dances, board games, Pistol Pete's Premier, motivational speakers, a hypnotist and contests of all sorts, Roundup delegates will have ample opportunity to have fun and learn. FCS Skill-athon, Job Readiness, 4-H Food Showdown, Livestock Quiz Bowl, tractor contest and more will give club members a chance to demonstrate their knowledge and skills against other 4-H'ers.

The Masonic Charity Foundation of Oklahoma Honor Night will

highlight the many accomplishments of club members. Two club members will be honored as the new Oklahoma 4-H Hall of Fame inductees. State record book winners will be announced, and winners will receive a scholarship, thanks to the generous donors who continue to support the Oklahoma 4-H Youth Development program. More than \$200,000 in scholarships will be awarded.

Club members will hear from peers who are campaigning for a spot on the state leadership team and have the opportunity to cast their votes. The current leadership team will bid their final farewell at the closing assembly.

"One of the favorite activities of Roundup is Pete's Premier. Because Roundup takes place on the OSU campus, it's a great time for delegates to learn more about the opportunities available to students at OSU," Allen said.

"Representatives from the various colleges on campus will be on hand to share more about different majors and what college life has to offer. It's a great opportunity to start thinking about what their future could look like at OSU."

To help delegates learn more about the campus, various tours and workshops from university departments will also be offered. "State 4-H Roundup is the biggest event that takes place each year and we're excited to have the delegates on campus," Allen said. "For more than a century, the OSU campus has been the gathering place for thousands of youth to come learn, create memories, forge friendships and make the most of their 4-H membership."

Richardson Memorial Horseman of the Year Scholarship

The purpose of this scholarship is for the Oklahoma Horse Program to recognize and promote the total involvement and development of the youth horse project member in all aspects of the Oklahoma youth Horse programs. It will not be an award strictly for show activities.

Qualifications:

Youth must be currently enrolled in 4-H (unless they are graduated seniors) Participation is limited to grades 9-12.

Must compete in two classes at the Oklahoma State 4-H Horse Show

Must have completed at least the freshman year of high school and completed at least two years in the horse project, including the current year.

Previous winners will be ineligible to compete. The three finalists will be invited to interview in person. The interview will be on Friday, July 11 at the State Horse Show, in Chickasha, OK.

Entries must be received by June 15th for consideration. Contact the office for application.

Cost is \$15 and includes supplies, instructions and recipes for homemade jam and bread.



4-H Shooting Sports Instructor Training

Certification Training for 4-H Adult Volunteers in the 4-H Shooting Sports Program

The 4-H Shooting Sports program is one of the largest 4-H programs in the nation. Community-based and family-oriented, it offers a diverse curriculum that not only helps young people develop good citizenship, personal responsibility, and leadership skills but also teaches shooting safety and gun owner responsibility. Leaders will be trained to help youth learn self-discipline, sportsmanship, ethical behavior, and an appreciation for the great outdoors.

Training Dates: August 16-17, 2025

Location: Fairview, OK – Major County Fairgrounds and Historical Society

Cost: \$100, registration fee covers instructor manual, class materials, meals, snacks, and insurance.

Courses: Shotgun, Archery, Rifle/Pistol, Muzzleloader, Hunting Skills, Western Heritage

Registration fee must be paid online or to County OSU Extension Office by August 4, 2025.

Requirements:

- Shooting Sports Instructor Training participants must be a certified 4-H Volunteer in their home county.
- All adults serving as county coaches in any discipline or as the county coordinator of the 4-H Shooting Sports Program must complete and pass the entire training in their discipline or as a coordinator and the Youth Development/Risk Management component.
- The instructor in each class reserves the right to NOT certify a person if he/she feels the candidate will not be a competent instructor or coordinator.

An Adult Medical Form 4 is required for each participant.

We highly recommend you complete &/or update the Medical Health form in your ZSuite volunteer enrollment.
