State Conference 2024 (Mike Gwinnup): Mike let us know that the expenses for hosting the State Conference will be over \$14,000. The cost for the convention is \$85 per person, volunteers included. Volunteers registering and paying has been a standard for Master Gardener state conventions. Ruth Carvalho broke down the convention costs as follows: Stride Center \$11,000

(pays for rooms, AV support, and lunch for \$300) Heritage Center \$1,300 (Live music, bartender and food for each venue), printing and signage \$700, speaker fees (9) \$1,300, name badges \$100, goody bags \$300.00, table decorations will be made by Teresa Boeckman. All totaling \$14,700. Our break-even point is 177 people. Amber Gill motioned to accept the cost per person to attend the state conference at \$85. Barbi Oliver seconded the motion. The motion passed. The SC committee is looking for sponsors to partner with us at the conference. A sponsorship is \$250. Two more vendors are needed. SC currently has six. Also needed are door prize giveaways. Kathryn Redding proposed possibly adding a silent auction to the state conference, if the SC committee is interested.

**New Business:** Amber Gill brought hollyhock and blanket flower seeds for members to take. Linda Severin also brought hollyhock seeds to share as well. Mickey Chapman brought sedge to share
