<u>Demonstration Garden</u> (Mike Gwinnup): A lot has been happening in the garden. Linda Presa and her friend Keith, stained the bridges along with some other areas. They are planning to continue staining other items in the garden that need a refresh. Jenny and Diane are in the process of repainting the flowers on the back fence and it is looking very good. They plan on painting the door to the shed and the flower boxes. Amber Gill has been labeling plants. Gary Lyon trimmed up the mulberry and cypress trees. Some additional plants have

been added to the Sensory Garden. We do have a problem with a couple of trees. The large Bur oak has a fungus and several of the limbs that are not looking that good. We have requested that Bradley Jennings do an injection treatment for it. The Bosnia Pine also has a fungus. Mike has sprayed it with a copper fungicide, it may need to be sprayed again. The Redbud in front of the office had died. Mike cut it down to just a long stump. Rick Nelson had someone remove the stump. It has been suggested that we place some sort of structure on it. The Rock Snake has been captured and temporarily imprisoned in the shed until after the weddings this Friday and Saturday. Because of the weddings, we will have a work day this Thursday to put some finishing touches before they are held. We will start at 8:00 a.m. We will have another work day on September 28th to spruce everything up before the conference. It will be from 8:00 to 10:00 a.m. We will have a work day at the Cherokee Strip Museum garden to help clean up. You will receive an email with the day and time.
