Committee Reports:

Demonstration Garden: Mike Gwinnup

Two workdays were scheduled in May. 6-7 people worked each day and more people are needed. 30 bags of mulch were purchased and most have been laid out. The bulbs given by Ponca City Master Gardeners are growing. Three saplings are in the greenhouse and may be planted in the fall. There are two maples and one elm. Steve Case completed removing all weeds from the pocket prairie garden and seeds have been scattered in it. Diane Ford moved that a commercial trimmer be purchased for the garden. Steve Case will research this, and discussion will continue at the next meeting. The motion was tabled until July. The new shed needs to be painted. Pam Lyon made a motion to paint the shed the same color as the undercoat and to paint the trim a darker shade of the same color. Heidi Bender seconded the motion and the motion was approved.

Garden Tea Fundraiser:

Jenny Gwinnup reported that 48 tickets were sold for \$1,645.00. A \$300.00 donation was given making a total income of \$1945.00. Total expenses for printing (\$21.82) and the musicians (\$300.00). The total profit of the tea was \$1,623.18.
