Message from Janet Coontz Garfield County Master Gardeners President

The word for the month of February is **patience**. We have recently experienced some lovely springlike weather which is greatly appreciated after the recent cold weather. Warm temperatures at this time of year always give us a case of Spring Fever. It gives one the itch to clean out garden beds and begin planting seeds. We need to hold fast and not start actively gardening quite yet. With our average last freeze date the middle of April, it is still a little early to begin planting. By the end of February we can start cutting grasses back and begin clearing out flowerbeds. Cool weather plants can be started towards the end of the month. You know we can count on more cold weather before it really is spring. February is a great month to exercise that spring fever on getting ready for spring. It is the best time to start planning for your garden. Think about the changes you want to make and any building projects your garden needs, such as raised beds and trellises. These can be built now before you are ready to plant. Make amendments to your soil as needed. Turn your compost or if you don't have one, create a composter. It is also a good time to examine your garden tools and pots. The end of the month is a good time to prune roses and any other shrubs that need spring pruning. Just remember that shrubs that bloom in spring should not be pruned until after they bloom. You can also add mulch in areas that need more. Of course you can spend hours in catalogs and on-line searching for seeds you wish to try this year. Remember that February is a great time to purchase seeds, but not to plant them! Practice patience!
