With approximately 125 members and 15 board members, the **Muskogee County Cattlemen's Association** meets the first Tuesday of the month to discuss and support the beef industry in our community through scholarships and educational programs.

The OSU **Soil, Water and Forage Analytical Laboratory** (SWFAL) provides soil testing, plant, animal waste and water analyses for anyone who needs agricultural testing services. In the past 3 months Muskogee County residents and producers received results from the following: **51 soil, 10 chicken litter, 1 water, 7 forage and 7 soil texture tests**. These results help users protect and utilize their soil, water, animal manure and forage resources efficiently and effectively.



Muskogee County Master Gardeners

are volunteers, trained by OSU Extension, who help the county meet the demand for horticulture knowledge as well as community beautification projects. They meet on the 4th Thursday of the month with 43 members attending the January meeting.





Muskogee Farmers' Market

is supported by various OSU programs: Master Gardener's, Family & Consumer Science (FCS), & Community Nutrition Education Program (CNEP). Planning meetings are underway for the 2025 season.



Oklahoma Home and Community Education
