Noble County Oklahoma Home and Community Education
Annual Educational Scholarships
Due April 14, 2023 (Friday)

1. The Bettie Qualls Memorial scholarship – \$1000.00.
The Kay Tipton honorary scholarship - \$1000.00.
2. Recipient will be chosen according to scholarship, character, leadership and need.
3. Recipients are **NOT** required to be a member of 4-H or FFA to receive scholarship.
4. Scholarship may be applied to any college or technical school of higher education in Oklahoma.
5. Half of the scholarship value will be given at the beginning of the school year with proof of enrollment and schedule for first semester. The remainder to be given at the beginning of the second semester upon proof of completion of at least 12 hours with minimum of 2.5 grade average from first semester. Provided these requirements are not met the scholarships will go to the next eligible applicant.
6. Recipient shall be any student of Noble County and plan to attend college or technical school, within the state of Oklahoma.
7. Scholarship will be awarded after completion of high school and enrollment in college.
8. All scholarship moneys shall be made payable to and sent to the college, university, or technical school.
9. Applications will be available at county high schools and at the Noble County OSU Extension Office by close of business on due date. Applications must be completed and sent to:
