Citizenship Washington Focus

Citizenship Washington Focus is a 4-H leadership program for high school youth held June 16-25, 2022. The program is aimed at enriching young peo-

ple's lives by broadening their appreciation and respect for themselves and others in the world. Participants attend workshops, committees, field trips and social events, giving them hands-on opportunities to learn and grow. Participants learn and practice skills that will make them better citizens and more successful individuals.

To be eligible to attend Citizenship Washington Focus, youth must be at least 15 years of age by June 1, 2022. Youth must have an ACTIVE status in online 4-H enrollment system. Youth who are graduating in 2022 may attend CWF in 2022.

Transmittal forms and total payment are **due** to the Okfuskee County Extension office by *February 14th*. Cost for the 10 day program is \$2,200 per delegate.

Payment for delegate must be received with transmittal form by deadline above to be considered a registered delegate. There are 49 delegate spots available. The registered and paid delegates will be placed in spots on a first come and paid basis. If there are unfilled spots available, alternates will be listed by age and birthdate and spots will be filled oldest to youngest.

The Oklahoma 4-H Foundation Rule of Law Travel Scholarships are available to youth to cover a portion of the cost. Applications for the Rule of Law Scholarships must be submitted to Amanda by *January 13th, 2022*. All Forms are available at the Office **4-H**





A record book is not meant to be a chore. Instead, it is a way for you to learn. Here are some important reasons why 4-H expects you to complete a 4-H Record Book for your project.


By turning in a county medal folder you will be recognized at the county achievement banquet and receive a project pin for all the hard work you have done on your projects. By turning in a permanent record book you will have the chance to try for higher up awards like County Hall Fame, Outstanding Achievement, Outstanding Agriculture Awards, and Outstanding Record Book.

Keeping a 4-H record book will help you:

- *Learn how to organize yourself
- *Learn how to use project objectives to set goals and plan your project work for the year
- *Learn how to set reasonable goals for yourself
- *Appreciate and explain what you've learned this year in your project work
- *Gather information needed to apply for awards
- *Meet requirements to participate in some county and state 4-H events
