ATTENTION VOTERS:

(This is not the original copy of the press release but a condensed copy of it from Susan Hart. She wanted to make sure we all were informed and did not think it was Spam.) Thank you, Susan, for taking care of us.

By state law, the Oklahoma State Election Board must keep voter rolls up to date.

- Over the next several weeks, the State Election Board will send an ADDRESS CONFIRMATION NOTICE to some registered voters in Oklahoma whose addresses are unclear.
- If you receive an ADDRESS CONFIRMATION NOTICE, you have 60 days to respond. You can respond by filling out and mailing the card you receive with the notice or by using the OK Voter Portal. https://okvoterportal.okelections.us/
- If you do not respond within 60 days, you will be placed on 'inactive' status and, by state law, removed from the voter rolls after the 2028 General Election.
- You can avoid "inactive" voter status and removal from the voter registration rolls by updating your voter registration or voting in any election before the 2028 General Election.
- It is always wise to check the OK Voter Portal to verify that you are registered, to ensure that your name and current address are correct, and to verify or change party affiliation.

To learn more about the Address Confirmation Notice process in Oklahoma, visit the <u>State Election Board website</u>. Voters with specific questions regarding their registration should contact their <u>County Election Board</u>.

Beefy Taco Salad

Ingredients:

- 1 lb 90/10 lean ground beef
- 1Tbsp chili powder
- 4 cups chopped romaine lettuce
- 1 (15.5 oz) can pinto beans, drained and rinsed
- 4 tomatoes, diced
- 1 cup frozen corn
- 2 green onions, sliced
- ¼ cup queso fresco
- ¼ cup plain non-fat Greek yogurt
- 1 lime, juiced
- 2 Tbsp minced fresh cilantro
- 1 cup crushed whole-grain tortilla chips

Preparation:

- * Heat a large skillet over medium-high. Add beef and chili powder. Cook 8-10 minutes or until cooked through, crumbling meat throughout. Drain excess liquid if needed.
- * In a large bowl, add lettuce, beans, tomatoes, corn, onions and queso fresco. Toss to combine. Top with slightly cooled beef.
- * In a small bowl, stir together yogurt, lime juice and cilantro to make the dressing.
