







# REPORT TO THE PUBLIC September 2021

## "Home-Grown Gardening"

On September 1, 2021, Horticulture Educator, Julia Laughlin, and Agriculture & Natural Resources Educator, Joshua Campbell, offered a free workshop called "Home-Grown Gardening" at the OSU Extension Conference Center. The workshop was designed to help beginning backyard gardeners learn the basics of growing vegetables, fruits and herbs. Topics covered included soil improvement, site selection, vegetable production for central Oklahoma, and basic pest control tips. Other topics discussed were basic composting, irrigation options and design, as well as harvesting/storage tips for produce. Approximately 80 participants attended the workshop which also included a tour of the teaching gardens at the OSU Extension Center.

#### **Nutrition Food Demo at OIC**

Taylor Conner, Family & Consumer Sciences
Educator and Registered Dietitian, recently
partnered with the organization, Opportunities
Industrialization Center of Oklahoma County, Inc.
(OIC). Taylor demonstrated how to make Corn
and Tomato Salad using fresh tomatoes from the
garden at OIC.

The purpose of the food demonstration was to show the students how fresh garden goods could easily be added to a dish to create a nutritious meal. Taylor also talked about fresh herbs such as basil, rosemary, and thyme and how they can be topped on fresh produce to enhance the flavor without adding excess salt. Students also learned about MyPlate and the importance of incorporating the five food groups to make a more balanced meal.











## **Urban Agriculture**

The Master Composter Program, led by
Joshua Campbell, Urban Agriculture and
Natural Resources Educator, began on
September 15th and will continue through
October 20th, 2021. This six-week training
has our largest class ever with 40
participants. The Master Composter
Program goes in depth to teach participants
how to successfully compost at the home
and at community gardens.



On September 13th, 2021, Joshua Campbell, facilitated a virtual "Fall Lawn Care"

Workshop that included 95 participants from across Oklahoma County. This class highlighted lawn maintenance tips, irrigation options and considerations, and weed control strategies for the homeowner.









## "Adult Vaccines: What You Need to Know" Workshops

During the month of September, four workshops titled, "Adult Vaccines: What You Need to Know" were taught by Family and Consumer Sciences Educator, Lisa Hamblin. Attendees learned the benefits and risks of adult immunizations, the different types of vaccines, and which ingredients are commonly contained in vaccines. Additional information was provided regarding the most popular myths about vaccines and recommended immunization schedules for adults.

## **Nutrition Classes at ReMerge**

Donna Albright, Nutrition Education Assistant with the Community Nutrition Education Programs (CNEP), has been providing weekly nutrition classes at ReMerge. ReMerge offers an alternative to incarceration for women in Oklahoma County who have nonviolent felony convictions and are either pregnant, have children under five years of age, or have multiple minor children.

CNEP provides research-based, hands-on education about diet quality, food safety, physical activity, food security and food resource management. While attending CNEP classes, participants at ReMerge, learn important life skills such as meal planning, grocery shopping, food preparation, food safety, and the importance of physical activity.












