Backyard Water Gardening

On August 19, Oklahoma County OSU Extension Horticulture Educator, Julia Laughlin, taught a workshop on the basics of water features and water gardens. The lesson was designed to help beginning water gardeners select a site for a water garden and to design, build and maintain a backyard water garden. Ideal water gardening plants and how to overwinter them was also explained. The program was sponsored by the Oklahoma County Oklahoma Home and Community Education Group.
