NE OKC Local Flavor Market Vendor Resource Fair

The Vendor Resource Fair took place on July, 22nd, 2021, and was hosted by Oklahoma County OSU Intern, Jordan Baze. The purpose of the **Vendor Resource Fair was to provide producers** and other vendors the resources they need to expand or start their business. In addition to providing these resources, participants were informed about the new "NE OKC Local Flavor Market" that will be opening Spring 2022. Jordan, with the help of Horticulture Educator, Julia **Laughlin, and Agriculture & Natural Resources Educator, Joshua Campbell, secured a panel of** agriculture experts including Micaela Danker from the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry; James Arati of Langston University; Madeline Alewine and Chris Sala, from the Farm Service Agency.

Twenty-five participants attended the Vendor Resource Fair. Bedlam Barbeque, graciously donated the dinner. This event was a great success and Extension Educators, plan to continue it for years to come.











Pressure Canning Workshop

During the month of July, Taylor Conner, Family Consumer Sciences Educator, led another Pressure Canning Workshop. The class was full of individuals eager to learn about the canning process. For this class, fresh beets purchased from a local farm were used for the demonstration.

The 3 1/2 hour, hands-on workshop led the participants through preparing the produce, packing it into jars, and processing them using the pressure canning method. Each individual took home a Ball Blue Canning Book, a jar of beets, and other resources on canning.

There will be one more Pressure Canning workshop this year in August.

Plant-It Earth Day Camp

On July 16th, 2021, Oklahoma County Horticulture Educator, Julia Laughlin, and the Agriculture Natural Resources Educator, Joshua Campbell, hosted "Plant-It Earth" for youth. This camp focused on educational activities related to the environment and the conservation of natural resources.

Students were engaged in lessons and handson activities including making seed balls for
wildflower gardens to sow this fall, planting a
take-home fall garden in their own "Smartpot"
with tomatoes and basil, and a tour of the
Extension's teaching gardens. Students also
learned about pollinators, the origins of
agricultural and food crops, and the importance
of water conservation. They created water
conservation posters and will compete in the
Oklahoma County Free Fair in August.

Twenty-eight youth attended the camp. They were served a locally sourced lunch by Chef Kamala Gamble of "Kam's Kookery" in Oklahoma City. The youth were also taught a lesson on locally grown food sources. It was a great day for everyone!
