With the food and monetary donations received, CNEP staff delivered Holiday baskets to four Oklahoma County families.

Almost 800 stockings were presented to those organizations at the luncheon. Additionally, OHCE Genealogy member, Jan Beattie, presented an interesting program on the history of Santa Claus around the world.

As part of the on-going "Four Seasons Living""
workshop series, the "What About Winter"
workshop was offered on November 19. This
workshop was taught by the Horticulture Educator,
Julia Laughlin, Urban Agriculture & Natural
Resources Educator, Joshua Campbell. Taylor
Conner, Family & Consumer Sciences Educator,
also helped teach the course and gave a seasonal
produce recipe demonstration and food tasting.

Topics covered included winter garden tasks, pruning of trees and shrubs and late winter vegetable gardening. Cool season lawn care and winterizing irrigation systems was also covered as well as other topics.

Approximately 40 people attended the workshop. The next workshop in this series will be "Step into Spring" and will be offered February 17.



### **Community Composting Support**



In December, 2021 the Master Composter volunteer group led by Urban Agriculture and Natural Resources Educator Joshua Campbell partnered with the City of Oklahoma City Parks Department to begin providing weekly support to develop a composting program at Will Rogers Gardens.

Master composters are serving each Friday morning taking waste material from local food pantries along with waste material from the park and turning it into a rich compost to be used in the park and as a resource for the community.



















### **4-H Gives the Community HUGS**

Every year, Oklahoma County 4-H participates in a service project known as HUGS. We collect Hats, Underwear, Gloves and Socks and donated to two organizations, the Homeless Alliance and Citizens Caring for Children. Both organizations serve the City Oklahoma and area surrounding communities. The Homeless Alliance provides many services for the unhoused population. Citizens Caring for Children provides clothing, backpacks, toys, and other necessities for children in foster care in the form of a resource center where they can "shop" for the items they like and need.

Efforts this year to increase the amount collected were rewarded. Clothing items were donated in around the community. Monetary boxes donations were welcomed from Master Gardeners, OHCE members, staff members of the County Courthouse, and McIntyre Law receiving the Noble Cause award for October. Combining those donations, over 2,500 items were given to the organizations.



### **Self-Care and Well-Being A Priority**

Rachel Morse, OSU Extension Multi-County 4-H
Youth Mental Health Educator, traveled in
December to the Family and Consumer Sciences
Northeast and Southeast District in-service in
Miami, Oklahoma. While there, she led the group
in activities for promoting self-care, mental wellbeing, and goal setting. This workshop was
approximately an hour long and contained handson and interactive exercises appropriate for youth
as well as for adults. Educators in both Districts
can easily replicate these activities and share
them with their own 4-H clubs and group leaders.
