Youth Mental Health First Aid

During the month of December Danyelle Kuss,
Youth Mental Health Specialist and Educator
taught the Youth Mental Health First Aid
curriculum. Youth Mental Health First Aid teaches
adults how to identify, understand and respond to
signs of mental health and substance use
challenges among children and adolescents ages
12-18. It is similar to being certified in CPR. In
total 10 County educators and 2 Oklahoma County
Master Wellness Volunteers were certified as
Youth Mental Health First Aiders. This is a
valuable step in building understanding, feelings
of competency and creating educated adults who
are resources for our kids when they struggle.

Wellness Days Stress Management

Danyelle Kuss was also invited to participate in Wellness Days where she educated over 200 5th graders in stress management skills that they can utilize in their daily life. Students practiced breathing techniques to increase focus and help calm overwhelming emotions and created a stress coping plan to use in the future.
