Developing Water Efficient Landscapes in Oklahoma

Julia Laughlin, OSU Extension Horticulture Educator, presented several workshops in May on how to develop water efficient landscapes in Oklahoma. The Martin Nature Center hosted a free public workshop on May 16th and the University of Oklahoma's LiveWelll OU program had Julia as a guest speaker for their employees on May 22nd.

Julia discussed the concept of a water smart landscape and illustrated how to maintain a diversity of color while using pollinator-friendly plants. She also emphasized cultivating drought tolerant plants to help reduce water consumption.


