

A New Class of Master Gardeners Begins

On September 3rd, a new class of Master Gardener volunteers began their coursework in a 12 week horticulture and gardening course, taught by OSU Extension Educators and Specialists.

Classes include vegetable gardening, turfgrass management, tree and shrub care, annual and perennial garden plants, pruning, plant propagation, soil health, composting and much more.

The 35 students will also work in local community gardens as interns in the spring and continue until graduation as Certified Master Gardeners in the fall of 2025.

OSU Extension Horticulturist, Julia Laughlin, is the advisor to the Master Gardeners.

The Oklahoma County Free Fair Horse Show was held on September 7th at the State Fair Park.

Youth competed in a variety of categories including speed events, English and Western riding, and jumping classes. High Point awards were given in the age groups of 8-11 years old, 12-14, and 15-19 years old. In addition to winning ribbons, riders were awarded cash premiums and special banners were given to the top two overall competitors in each age group.

Oklahoma County had fourteen 4-H members who qualified to enter their exhibits in the Oklahoma State Fair. There were a total of 74 exhibits from Oklahoma County and 38 of them took home ribbons from the competition.
















Youth Organizations Engage in Mental Health Skill Building

Youth Mental Health Specialist, Danyelle Kuss, recently met with representatives and leaders of the Girl Scouts of Western Oklahoma and The Oklahoma Association of Youth Services. Participants engaged in workshops centered around mental health resiliency skills that can be recreated with the youth that these agencies serve.

Gratitude was a highlighted skill focusing on its positive impact on health and well being. These benefits can include greater happiness and optimism, stronger relationships, lowered blood pressure and more effective sleep. Gratitude can also help reduce the risk of some mental health disorders.

Participants were given multiple activities for teaching youth how to tap into their gratitude super power, which included gratitude bags. The Oklahoma Association for Youth Services was also introduced to the game Cope-Able, which can be used with youth to build healthier coping skills and better understand the pattern of coping in our lives.
