## Community Partnership for Nutrition

Every other month, Family & Consumer Sciences Educator and Registered Dietitian, Taylor Conner partners with Providence Apartments to teach food and nutrition-related programs for their residents. During the month of June, Taylor taught a workshop on making grape jelly. The residents learned how water bath canning works and filled their own jars with jelly. The group consisted of both adults and youth. Everyone who participated took home a jar of freshly made jelly.















### **OHCE DONATES TO VETERANS**

The Oklahoma Home and Community Education (OHCE) volunteers' recent community service project honored patients at the Veterans Medical Center in Oklahoma City. For the past year, they collected personal care items, such as razors, shaving cream, shampoo, and toothbrushes, filled tote bags, and delivered them to each patient. Seventy-five veterans received the bags, that also included journals, puzzle books, and paperbacks to make their stay more pleasant. This is the 3rd year for the annual project.

### BABYSITTING WORKSHOPS HELD ACROSS THE METRO

Family and Consumer Sciences Educator, Lisa Hamblin, taught four Babysitting 101 workshops during the month of June. Forty-seven teens were trained in child development, safe practices, and how to manage and

market their business. Oklahoma County Safety Coordinator, Don Gust, certified the students in CPR, First Aid and AED. Additional guest speakers included representatives from City/County Health Department, Extension Community Nutrition Education Program

(CNEP), and OSU summer intern, Moriah Donica. Workshops were held at OSU-OKC, Midwest City Library, The Village Library, and St. Paul the Apostle Catholic Church in Del City. A fall break Babysitting 101 workshop is planned in partnership with the Edmond Parks and Recreation Department for October 13-14th.











# Kid's Rock Camp

Oklahoma County OSU Extension has been partnering with the Bethel Foundation "Kids Rock Camp" for 18 years. This is a week-long camp for children from single parent homes to learn life skills. OSU Extension staff, intern and volunteers provided hands-on activities for the campers in the areas of nutrition, physical activity, and water conservation. The kids were taught the importance of hand washing and MyPlate. They also learned ways to conserve water and took home their own succulent plant. On the last day of camp, they were taught how to relax their body and mind with Yoga.

Every day the youth were shown how to prepare their own meals by reading the recipes and following instructions. After the dishes were cooked, the youth ate their creations, and many had the chance to try new foods.











### Urban Gardener Podcast Gaining Popularity

This month Horticulture Educator Julia Laughlin and Urban Ag/Natural Resources Educator Joshua

Campbell created and posted their 5th "Urban Gardener" podcast which is available on Spotify and is also available as a YouTube video. Julia and Josh started the podcast in March of 2022 and they are generally 20-25 minutes in length, addressing local issues and concerns for anyone gardening in urban areas. A large focus of the podcast content is on managing natural resources carefully, including the use of safe pesticides, and water conservation.



The NEA's earned numerous awards including the "highest number of adult participants this fiscal year." They served on multiple committees throughout 2021 - 2022, and volunteered to serve on additional committees this upcoming year in order to help others. In addition, the partnership with Eugene Fields Elementary School earned the Friends of CNEP award and was presented to Ms. Paige Bressman, Principal at Eugene Fields Elementary, of Oklahoma City Pubic Schools. ### **Upcoming CNEP Projects**

The Oklahoma Unit of CNEP is implementing three special projects in the upcoming months:

- **Fresh Start Plus Training**: This is the core adult curriculum with the addition of food demos and resources to see if the additional activities increase participants behavior changes and retain participants.
- Harvest Highlights: The Eastside Fresh Market will feature monthly market tours and a food demonstration. On June 21st and 22nd, the NEA's held a Facebook Live event on the Eastside Fresh Market Facebook page focusing on fresh produce and ways to prepare it. The July Harvest Highlights will be LIVE on Facebook on July 26th and 29th, 2022.
- MyPlate: "Keeping Oklahoma Families Strong, One Plate at a Time Program" in partnership with ONIE Project, we will implement this piloted nutrition program this August and September.
