












REPORT TO THE PUBLIC May 2023

OHCE WEEK CELEBRATED WITH MANY ACTIVITIES

Volunteers of the Oklahoma County OHCE (Oklahoma Home and Community Education) organization celebrated OHCE Week May 7-13. President Gayla Mosteller read the OHCE Week proclamation at the Board of County Commissioners meeting to kick off the week of activities. The week also included a trip to the First Americans Museum, the annual achievement awards luncheon, displays in local libraries, and volunteering with the 4-H Mother's Day Tea fundraiser. Two new OHCE groups were started this year, for a total of eight groups across Oklahoma County.











Ralph Ellison Library Program

During May, Taylor Conner, FCS Educator and Registered Dietitian, partnered with Ralph Ellison Library to teach "Intro to Air Fryers". The program took place on a Monday afternoon with nearly 20 people in attendance.

Taylor talked about how air fryers work and why they can be a healthier choice in comparison to deep fryers. She also shared how to choose an air fryer for those who are considering buying one and how to clean and store the units.

Afterwards, Taylor conducted a food demonstration with an air fryer tofu recipe. This provided an opportunity on how to use the unit as well as touch on protein food alternatives such as tofu.















Water Conservation Programs

In May 2023, Urban Agriculture
Educator Joshua Campbell presented
a series of educational programs
including three Water Conservation in
the Garden programs at the
Downtown OKC, Southern Oaks, and
Ralph Ellison libraries. In this
workshop series he discussed how to
plan for irrigation and other important
considerations for efficient
management of water for landscape
and vegetable gardens.

In addition, he teamed up with the Oklahoma County Conservation
District to teach a compost and soil health workshop at Will Rogers
Gardens.

and mental health issues that impact the health of both the mother and child.

The Oklahoma County Horticulture Educator, Julia Laughlin, and the Oklahoma County Master Gardeners are working on their second season of developing "Grow a Row for the Hungry" Community Garden at the Oklahoma City County Health Department NE Regional Health & Wellness Campus community garden. Approximately 8 volunteers are involved with this project and this year they are growing in three 14 x14 beds which will produce tomatoes, cabbage, sweet peppers, yellow squash, zucchini, cantaloups, winter squash and cucumbers. All of the food they grow will be donated to food pantries in the Northeast sector of Oklahoma City.


