Oklahoma County OSU Extension Receives State Award

Oklahoma County OSU Extension was presented the "Outstanding County Unit Collaboration Award" at the 2024 Extension Biennial Conference held in Stillwater. The purpose of the award was to recognize a county unit for their collaboration on a major program or response to an emerging need.

Oklahoma County OSU Extension identified the need for access to local, fresh, and healthy foods in Northeast OKC. Educators then took the initiative and established a weekly farmer's market.

Only one award across the state was given and Oklahoma County was recognized for their teamwork in developing and running the Eastside Fresh Market.











Lisa Hamblin, Family & Consumer Sciences Educator Receives "Excellence in Diversity & Outreach Award"



Lisa received the award for the National Fatherhood Initiative's Inside/Out Dad workshop series. Lisa has been teaching this 12-week program since November 2022 at the Federal Transfer Center Prison.

The classes helped fathers learn better communication and problem-solving skills, so their phone conversations and visits with their children were meaningful.

Lisa also was recognized at the January Oklahoma
County Board of County Commissioners meeting with
a Resolution for commending Lisa on her award and
dedication to the people of Oklahoma County.















Girl Scouts Cooking Class

During January, Taylor Conner, FCS Educator and Registered Dietitian, led a fun and educational cooking class for 16 Girl Scouts, including Brownie and Daisy Scouts. The focus of the class was on making healthy snacks that follow the MyPlate food guidance system. Taylor started by talking to the girls about the importance of eating fruits, vegetables, protein, grains, and dairy. They discussed how these food groups give us energy and help our bodies grow.

Then, they worked together to make two tasty snacks that incorporated multiple food groups. First, they made individual mini pizzas on English muffins with tomato sauce, mozzarella, and vegetables, like mushrooms and olives. Next, they blended up fruit smoothies for a cool, nutritious treat. The girls had a great time customizing their own pizzas and smoothies. It was rewarding to teach them about healthy eating in a hands-on way.
















Poverty Simulation

Legal Aid Services Of Oklahoma, Inc. reached out to partner with OSU Extension to hold a "Poverty Simulation" for their staff. They wanted to help their staff better understand the stress, challenges, and realities their clients live with on a daily basis.

Poverty is a reality for many individuals and families. But unless poverty has been experienced, it's difficult to truly understand. This training bridges the gap from misconception to understanding. The goal is to shift the paradigm about poverty away from being seen as a personal failure and toward it being understood as a failure of society.

Several OSU Extension Family & Consumer
Sciences Educators across the state have been
trained to be facilitators of the Missouri
Community Action Network Poverty Simulation.
These trained educators along with Oklahoma
County OSU Extension staff provided a 1/2 day
training to the paralegals and lawyers working for
Legal Aid Services.
















Master Gardeners at Oklahoma City Home and Garden Show
