OSU Extension Staff Receives Southern Region Award

A group of 30 Family & Consumer Sciences Educators across the state traveled to Providence, Rhode Island to take part in the National Extension Association of Family and Consumer Sciences conference.

During the conference, LaDonna Hines, Joshua Campbell and Julia Laughlin received 2nd Place Southern Region award for "Program Excellence Through Research". Hines, accepted the award for the team.

The purpose of this research project was to assess the practicality of a new NE OKC

Farmer's Market which would improve community food access. The "Eastside Fresh Market" was the outcome of this project. The study was performed with the partnership of Lynn Institute for Healthcare Research.











Fermenting Foods

Oklahoma County Master Wellness Volunteers learned all about fermenting foods during their September 22nd meeting. Taylor Conner, FCS Educator and MWV Advisor, explained the science of fermentation. Volunteers also learned about the benefits of fermented foods and gut health. Afterward, volunteers had hands-on experience in making their own sauerkraut to ferment at home. Some of the volunteers will be assisting with an upcoming public workshop at the County office using their new knowledge of fermented foods.













2023 Master Composter Class Begins

On September 13, the 2023 Master Composter class began. This six week course provides an indepth experience in composting at all scales from small backyard to large commercial composting. Students learn the science behind the composting process and tour composting facilites across the Oklahoma City metro. Each week, students hear from compost experts including university faculty, community leaders, and compost business owners.

Throughout the course, participants engage in hands-on compost learning experiences and are challenged to complete a compost related service project in their community. Joshua Campbell is the advisor to the Master Composters.









NEW Class of Master Gardeners Begins!

On September 3, a new class of Master Gardeners volunteers began their coursework as students in a 12 week horticulture and gardening course taught by OSU Educators and Specialists.

Classes will include vegetable gardening, turfgrass management, tree and shrub care, annual and perennial garden plants, pruning plant propagation, soil health, composting and much more. These volunteers will also work in gardens in our community as interns starting in the spring and continue to graduate as Cerified Master Gardeners in the fall next year. Julia Laughlin is the advisor to the Master Gardeners.



Strong Dads

OSU Extension acquired a contract with Oklahoma Human Services to implement fatherhood-specific services across the state. This past spring a \$9 million investment of TANF funding was given to increase men's involvement in family life.

The TANF funding supports the programming for OSU Extension Fatherhood program Strong Dads in 9 counties, which includes Oklahoma County. Strong Dads is a free 12-week fatherhood workshop offered in English and Spanish. Weekly classes are offered through the National Fatherhood Initiative's 24:7 Dad program. These classes include topics such as life skills, parenting knowledge, relationship skills, economic stability, positive community networks, knowledge of the family court system, co-parenting relationship quality,

and the importance of child support to fathers. The program offers weekly transportation stipends, incentives, resources, and one on one coaching and support. Dads can connect with other dads, build friendships, and expand their network. We create a supportive community, offering a space to share experiences, learn from each other, and grow as fathers. This FREE workshop is for dads of all ages and stages or

someone who portrays a father figure role. The uniqueness of Strong Dads is we can also provide the workshops to different organizations in house.
