Achievement Celebration & Fundraiser

It will soon be time for the Achievement Celebration! This Celebration is an awards ceremony for 4-H'ers who submitted a record book. We also recognize individuals who represented 4-H at District and State events including the Pecan Food Show, Tulsa State Fair, and Oklahoma Youth Expo. All Ottawa County members are welcome to come to the Achievement Celebration to support their fellow 4-H'ers. You may receive recognition for something you have done!

The 4-H Fundraiser is held shortly after the Achievement Celebration. A silent auction is held during the day's events but the main fundraiser is a "stick party". Participants buy bid sticks and use the sticks to bet. Each bet costs a quarter. The sticks are all numbered and have a matching coin with the same number. The auctioneer will ask who wants to bet their sticks on the item. Participants can bet however many sticks they have. The sticks that have a bet are "live", while the number is being drawn participants hold up these sticks. Sticks without a bet are "dead", leave these sticks on the table while the number is being drawn. A number is drawn for each item, whoever has that "live" stick wins the item. If the number drawn is a "dead" stick, the number will be drawn again until it is won by a "live" stick. New bets are placed with each item!

This is a fun fundraiser for everyone, be sure to save all your quarters and come participate. Please collect items for both the silent auction and "stick party".

Giving Tree Exhibit

Last year, the Giving Tree Exhibit was held for the first time by the Dobson Museum on Miami Main Street. Ottawa County 4-H participated in the event and decorated a 4-H themed Christmas tree that was displayed. The tree had 4-H promotion on it and there was a donation box place near the tree. We have added on new staff this year! We want to reintroduce everyone and explain some of what their job entails so you know who to contact.

Kathy Enyart—County Extension Director, Family and Consumer Science Educator, 4-H Youth Development Educator. Kathy organizes and offers programming in both FCS and 4-H. Her FCS programs includes advising the Ottawa County Home and Community Education groups, Co-Parenting Classes, Poverty Simulations, Food Nutrition, and more. Kathy can perform canning pressure cooker tests at the office. She holds classes for sewing, painting barn quilts, and cookie decorating. For 4-H, Kathy writes grants for our program and attends camps with our youth. She organizes events like our county contests and trips.

Jamie Foster—(FRTEP) Family and Consumer Science Educator, 4-H Youth Development Educator. Jamie is our newest hire. She came back to our office after 2 years in a different company. Jamie has 10 years of previous experience with our Extension office. She has been the Program Assistant and Support Specialist and is now an Educator. Jamie will be brining new 4-H programming to our county. She is striving to build our program and reaching more youth. She wants to provide more 4-H experience for those enrolled!

Reba Palmer—Agriculture Educator, 4-H Youth Development Educator. Reba has been with our office for 1 year as of July 17th. She focuses on Ag programming like Cowgirl Confident, Pesticide conferences, Poultry Waste Management conferences, Cattlewoman's Boot Camp, and much more. Reba performs in office nitrate tests. She does field visits to collect samples from farms to send to the OSU Laboratory. Once results are back, she analyzes them and offers suggestions for the clients. Reba's 4-H programming includes attending camps with youth and organizing classes. Reba also offers help with youth's livestock projects.

Samantha Williams—CNEP Nutrition Education Assistant. Samantha was hired in March of 2024. Her position of part of a District program. Samantha offers healthy nutrition classes to individuals of all ages. Some classes are Fresh Start and KIK it up. Samantha pairs with other groups of our community to hold classes such as the Boys and Girls Club and the Miami Public Library. Ottawa County Fair

The Ottawa County Fair has once again come to an end. We had a total of 272 exhibitors in the livestock shows, youth contests, and indoor exhibits. There were 1,148 Open Indoor Exhibits, 338 4-H Indoor Exhibits, and 39 FFA Indoor Exhibits in the Exhibition Building. In the livestock barn, there were 126 swine, 7 dairy, 38 sheep, 59 goats, and 54 beef animals. In the Poultry and Rabbit barn, we had 93 birds and 28 rabbits! Our fair was a blast, thank you to everyone who participated and to all of those who supported the exhibitors!
