The Pumpkin Show is open to all Payne County 4-H and Cloverbud youth between the ages of 5-18 years old. The participants will have an opportunity to decorate, carve, and paint their pumpkins, as well as bake foods using pumpkin. Participants may enter only one item in each class and the exhibit must be the work of the participant. Judges will evaluate each of the categories and classes, and their decisions will be final.

Pumpkins will be judged on originality, creativity, and neatness.

Payne County 4-H Pumpkin Show Guidelines

Age Divisions: (September 1, 2020)

- Cloverbud: Ages 5 - 2nd grade
Beginner Grades 3rd (and 8 years old), 4th & 5th
Intermediate Grades 6th—8th
Senior Grades 9th—12th



Guidelines for Participants:

The Pumpkin Show is open to all Payne County 4-H and Cloverbud youth between the ages of 5-18 years old.

The participants will have an opportunity to decorate, carve, and paint their pumpkins, as well as bake foods using pumpkin. Participants may enter only one item in each class and the exhibit must be the work of the participant. Judges will evaluate each of the categories and classes, and their decisions will be final. Pumpkins will be judged on originality, creativity, and neatness. **Name, address and age must be securely attached to each exhibit.** Posters must be 14" x 22" poster board and create a poster depicting one of the following topics related to *Cucurbita* species crop such as pumpkin, squash and gourd. **Posters must have members name, age (before 01/01/2021), year and club name on back.** No three dimensional posters. Copyrighted characters may not be used.

Categories and Classes

Posters

- A. History
- B. Production
- C. Use in different culture
- D. Use in different processed foods

Decorated Pumpkins

Be creative and have fun!

- D. Painted Pumpkin – Any type of paint may be used. The only embellishment allowed on the pumpkin is paint.
- E. Carved Pumpkin – The creation must be the exhibitor's.
- F. Decorated Pumpkin – Decorated with combination of any medium such as paint, construction paper, yarn, etc...
- G. Decorated People Pumpkins – Decorated with the combination of any medium such as paint, construction paper, yarn, etc. Exhibit, should be designed to represent a person or animal like body. Exhibit MUST have arms or legs attached.

Artificial Material Pumpkins & More

Anything goes here as long as pumpkin(s) are included and it is no larger than 4' x 4' and it made by the exhibitor. This can be outdoors or indoors décor. Examples are table, wall or door decorations or outdoor display in a yard, flowerbed or tree.

- H. Artificial Pumpkin Décor Items

Club Displays & Flat Flyers

Displays can be used the remainder of month of October to highlight 4-H. Display boards with sides must be used.

- I. Horticulture or Crops Display
- J. 4-H Promotional Display
- K. Flat Flyer promoting club or county fall program/activity. Computer generated flier (one side) size 8½x 11".

Pumpkin Dish

The dish must be prepared by the exhibitor and pumpkin must be the primary ingredient. Dessert, bread or vegetable dish or other categories can be made from fresh or canned pumpkin and **include recipe.** *Pumpkin dishes must be cooked.*

- L. Dessert
- M. Bread
- N. Vegetable Dish
- O. Decorated Cupcakes
- P. Decorated Cakes
- Q. Other- this would include items such as pumpkin soup, roasted pumpkins seeds, pumpkin chili, pumpkin ice cream (eggs must be cooked; No RAW eggs)
