#### COUNTY RECORD BOOKS DUE JANUARY 6, 2020

Did you know that you can work on record books year round? In fact those who do work on their record books throughout the year have less stress the week before they are due. I would like to encourage all 4-Hers to work on your record keeping skills throughout the year. Each month go through your record book and see if you have anything to add. Hopefully now since we are finishing up the fair season you have something to enter in the Exhibits Page, maybe you learned something while showing or getting your animal or project ready, and I am sure all of you "did" something. This all goes into your record book! Also if you start planning your speeches, service projects and leadership activities now you will have plenty to put in your book and get a GOLD Medallion in your project areas.

Reminder you are limited to 5 project areas. This is important because when our youth do State Record Books they can only submit 2 project areas. Helping them focus now should provide a stronger book. Also CWF Trip cost has steadily increased and cost more than all the other awards combined. We do feel this is important trip so we will pay for half of the trip.

Books are due by 5:00 p.m., Monday, January 6th with NO EXCEPTIONS! 5:00 is the time that the Courthouse locks the front door, that is the time we will stop taking books. If you need help let me know so we can schedule a time to meet.

## **RECORDBOOK REMINDERS**: (Due January 6th, by 5:00 pm)

REMINDER: When completing a recordbook, you should list your age for the year of the recordbook. If your book is for Jan. 1 – Dec. 31, 2019, you need to list your age as of September 1, 2018. This will determine if you are placed in the Junior or Senior category and which special awards you apply for.

Junior Awards: Age 13 and under as of September 1, beginning of your <u>recordbook</u> 4-H year. Senior Awards: Age 14 and over as of September 1, beginning of your <u>recordbook</u> 4-H year.

- \* Don't forget to add your zip code to your address on the second page.
- \* Make sure you include the sheet for selection of awards. Remember you can only choose 5 projects. Remember to list the medal you are applying for, not the year you received a medal.
- \* Don't forget to list County 4-H Events or Activities attended in the appropriate boxes.
- \* Special awards are on a separate page and the form must be complete. Can apply for 3 awards provided you have not won previously and meet the qualifications.
- \* Don't forget to have your book signed by your club leader before you turn the book in to the office.
- \* Make sure your book is in a binder or folder. (We have covers available for \$3.00) Cloverbuds <u>do</u> not need a binder or cover.
