5 MOST COMMON MISTAKES FOR FOOD DEMOS

As we prepare our speeches for Rally Day and put on the final touches here are a few things to remember when giving a food demonstration.

Don't bore them with measurements. No one wants to watch you measure out every ingredient. Solution: pre-measure everything and put in little bowls. It will keep your workspace organized.

Don't use overly fancy equipment. Remember you want this to be fun and easy. Use equipment most people will have in their homes.

Don't kill yourself preparing everything in advance. If you are in a workshop or club setting have participants wash their hands and don an apron and get involved too by chopping vegetables or grating cheese.

Don't hide the ingredients. Yes, you need to premeasure, but also show the box or bag the ingredient came from. Helps them identify the product in the grocery store.

Don't forget the presentation. A grand finale, before allowing everyone to taste you items, make a beautiful presentation on a large oversized platter. Use a white plate, everything looks professional and clean on a white plate.

These are just a few things to think about as you prepare your next food demonstration. Remember there is no substitution for PRACTICE! Don't forget to smile and have fun.
