# 2023 Seminole County Junior Livestock Show

## Premium Sale Official Rules

### LIVESTOCK REGULATIONS

1. Only students enrolled and in good standing with a Seminole County 4-H club or FFA chapter are eligible to compete in the Seminole County Junior Livestock Show. (Clover buds are not eligible to participate).
2. OYE Rules and Regulations will be used as a guide for the Seminole County Junior Livestock Show if a specific county rule is not in place.
3. All Decisions of the Judges are final and not disputable.
4. No diseased animal will be permitted to be exhibited or to occupy the exhibition stalls of the fairgrounds and every precaution will be used to enforce this rule, but the management will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may be sustained by anyone through any violation of this rule.
5. Livestock must be owned by the exhibitor on or before the nomination date of December 16, 2022.
6. Straw is not allowed to be used for bedding.
7. All species will show and be broken into listed breeds in the OYE rules for 2023.
8. Breeding heifers will need registration papers to be considered a specific breed.
9. Proof of negative test papers will be needed for swine (pseudorabies test).
10. All swine exhibitors must have premise ID.
11. Sheep and goats must have a Scrapie tag.
12. Junior livestock exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their own animals at and for the show.
13. Injections of any type are prohibited unless in the case of a stressing hog and epinephrine can be administered.
14. All livestock must be free from live external parasites, ringworm, and warts; if animals are infected, they will be asked to be removed from the fairgrounds.
15. Official dress representing the club / organization must be worn during the Show and Sale according to what the exhibitor is nominated under. OYE official dress rules will be used.
16. The Seminole County Junior Livestock Show follows OSSA & local school eligibility rules.
17. All clipping of an animal needs to be done by the exhibitor with minimal assistance. NO professionals will be allowed to clip on the grounds. **No fitting allowed!**
18. All Hogs must have permanent E840 ID and (ear notches) by entry due date, & ID numbers must be on the entry form.
19. Animals will be released at the conclusion of the sale order selection for that species.
20. Number of animal's that is in the sale is based off the number of Students that exhibit in the SCJLS (67% of exhibitors make the sale). Exhibitor spot numbering for the premium sale will be by: Heifer, Barrow, Wether Goat, Doe, Wether Lamb, Steer, Chicken, Ewe, Gilt and rotated every year. Exhibitors may only show 3 animals per division per species, however, you can still pre enter as many as you want. Only 1 animal per exhibitor may make the sale.
21. The highest selected animal will be the animal which sells in the premium auction. Only if an exhibitor has two animals that rank equally will they be allowed to choose which to sell.
22. Only Grand Champions and Reserve Grand Champions are guaranteed a spot in the premium sale (limit of one animal per exhibitor in the premium sale). (Champion and reserve

prospect steers will show against Champion and Reserve market steers for Grand Champion honors and sale line up).

23. All remaining premium sale spots will be selected in order by the species judge.

24. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroids or artificial filling internally.

26. The species superintendent has the right to move any animal to the crossbred division if it fails to satisfy the breed characteristics it was nominated under.

27. Any late entries will be handled on an individual case by case basis at the discretion of the Seminole County Fair Board.

28. Doe Goats will have the options to show in the market class or the breeding class but not both. Market goats will show slick sheared, breeding does can show with hair.

29. Showmanship will be by species and OYE ages will be used to determine the divisions.

30. Minimum and Maximum Weights and Ages will be enforced at Check-in. If you miss the window (Time or Weight) the animal will not be allowed to participate.

31. The Seminole County Fair Board will hold final ruling on all disputes.

32. The heifers will be shown by OYE breed and all breed champions will be in grand drive. Breeds will be based off the 2023 OYE Rules.

33. All hogs must have an E-840 Ear Tag for Identification, per state guidelines. Please work with your veterinarian to use the E-840 tags at time of Pseudo- Rabies blood work.

34. Agreement of Responsibility and Liability: Participants must maintain full control from the time of county nominations, custody, care and feeding of the animals and personal property that they bring on or about the premises of the SCJLS. It is clearly understood and agreed that the Seminole County Fair Board and the SCJLS and its officials, officers, directors, employees and agents – shall not be responsible for any damage, loss or injury to any person or property that is caused directly or indirectly for any reason at this show. The exhibitors agree to indemnify the SCJLS and hold the organization harmless for all damages, injuries, losses, expenses or liabilities that they may incur at this show, including any that may result from SCJLS enforcing its rules and regulations.

35. No minimum to make a breed for any species.

36. All Registration papers and tattoos will be verified at check in / weigh in time.

37. All entry forms must have an attached photo of species and exhibitor for nomination.

38. **Tentative schedule for Broiler birds, as they will not be ordered until entries are received on the 16<sup>th</sup>. Broiler chicks will hatch and ship on December 28<sup>th</sup> and arrive on either December 29<sup>th</sup> or 30<sup>th</sup>. The cost per 25 chicks will be \$92.50 due December 16<sup>th</sup>. This includes \$20 entry fee for the JLS, and \$72.50 for the chicks. The chicks will be marked with either a leg or wing band so we will know they are the original birds. The best 3 from your group of 25 would be brought to show. Premium sale slots would be the same as other species 2/3 of total exhibitors.**

39. **Exhibitor's must petition to the Fair Board for any late entries/documentation turned in after due date of December 16, 2022.**

## Sale selection example-

90 exhibitors check in animals at the show. ( $90 \times 67\% = 60$ ) There will be 60 animals sold in the sale.

Each species will use the same formulas. All animals will be lined up from grand to the last alternate. Premium sale slot numbering order will be by Heifer, Barrow, Wether Goat, Doe, Wether Lamb, Steer, Chicken, Ewe, Gilt starting with Grand Champions, Reserve Grand Champions and then lined up on the judge's selection order.

Pre-entries will not be used to determine number of animals sold. Only participants at the show will count in the formula.

No Exhibitor will be allowed to sell more than one animal in the SCJLS premium sale. If two or more animals are chosen the highest selected animal will automatically be sold.

# Sheep

**Ewe lambs may be shown as a market lamb or a breeding ewe but not as both.**

**Identification:** A Scrapie tag must be in the ear at the show weigh in time— NO EXCEPTIONS  
Market sheep will not be mouthed; however, breeding ewes may be mouthed to determine age (No aged ewes will be allowed to show at the SCJLS, only lambs and yearlings).

## Market Lambs

**Ownership:** Exhibitors must maintain continuous ownership, and possession for each market lamb from the time of nomination through the conclusion of the premium auction. Exhibitors may show three market lambs.

**Grooming:** No changing the confirmation of any animal. All lambs must be slick shorn prior to classification. There can be no wool above the knees or hocks. The use of hydration utensils and the use of soft muzzles are permitted in the stalls only. Soft muzzles must be removed from lambs any time they are taken from their stall for any reason.

**Weight:** The minimum weight requirement for market lambs is 75 pounds. There is no maximum weight limit. No late weigh-ins

**Classification:** All animals will be shown according to the breed classifications used at OYE. The Sheep Superintendent has the right to move a lamb to the crossbred division if it fails to satisfy the breed characteristics it was nominated under.

## Breeding Ewes

**Ownership:** Exhibitors must maintain continuous ownership, and possession for each Breeding Ewe from the time of nomination through the conclusion of the premium auction. Exhibitors may show up to three Breeding Ewes.

**Classification:** All animals will be shown according to the breed classifications used at OYE & birthdate or by commercial weight. (Registration papers will be required for purebred ewes; others will show as crossbred ewes.)

**Slick Shorn:** All breeding sheep must be slick shorn prior to showing. No wool is allowed above the knees or hocks.

**Weight:** The minimum weight is 75 pounds. There is no maximum weight. No late weigh-ins.

**Age:** Ewe Lambs must have all 8 temporary incisors with no visible signs of permanent incisors. Yearling ewes must have 6 temporary incisors and one pair of permanent incisors. Aged Ewes are not allowed to show in the SCJLS.

## Goats

**Ownership:** Exhibitors must maintain continuous ownership, possession and provide daily care for each market and doe goat from the time of nomination through the conclusion of the premium auction

**Identification:** Scrapie tag must be in the ear at the show weigh in time – NO EXCEPTIONS

**Horns:** Horns should be tipped and rounded. Goats with horns sharper than deemed safe by the show superintendent or fair staff will be required to be tipped or rounded or isolated and not shown.

**Muzzles:** The use of hydration utensils and the use of soft muzzles are permitted in the stalls only. Soft muzzles must be removed from goats any time they are taken from their stall for any reason.

**Bracing:** Does can be braced to set up but when being judged they must be controlled by chain or halter. Market Goats can be braced, it is optional. **The animals must have all four feet on the ground.** Animals must be shown with a collar or halter used only to control the animal.

## Market Goats

**Eligibility:** Exhibitors may show three market goats.

**Weight:** Minimum weight requirement for market goats is 40 pounds and maximum weight is 155. No late weigh-ins.

**Classification:** One division to be broken by weight.

**Grooming:** Artificial coloring and painting above the flank are not permitted for use in the market wether division during the show.

**Shearing:** Market Goats must be sheared to a maximum of 3/8" residual hair length.

## Breeding Does

**Eligibility:** Exhibitors may show three doe goats.

**Weight:** Minimum weight requirement for does is 40 pounds and maximum is 155. No late weigh-ins.

**Classification:** One division to be broken by weight.

**Grooming:** Artificial coloring and paint above the flank are not permitted for use in the doe division during the show.

## Cattle Steers

**Ownership:** Each exhibitor may show three steers. The exhibitor must maintain continuous ownership, possession and provide daily care from the time of nomination through the conclusion of the premium auction.

**Classification:** Steers will be shown according to the 2023 OYE breed requirements.

**Grooming:** Junior livestock exhibitors are expected to groom their animals for show. Grooming by professionals is prohibited & will result in disqualification. **No fitting allowed!**

**Weight:** Market (1000+) and Prospect (999-) classes will be broken by weight. Champion market and champion prospect will compete for the Grand Steer.

## Breeding Heifers

**Ownership:** Exhibitors must have owned and cared for the animals from the time of nomination through the conclusion of the premium auction. All heifers must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. All commercial heifers will be shown by weight.

**Classification:** Heifers will show based on the breeds designated in the 2023 OYE rules. Registered animal of any OYE breed makes a breed. No Minimum to make a breed.

Class breaks will be determined at the show. All heifers must be born after January 1, 2021 and not had a calf.

**Grooming:** Junior livestock exhibitors are expected to groom his/her own animals for show with minimal assistance. Grooming by professionals is prohibited and will result in disqualification. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed. **No fitting allowed!**

**Filling:** No force or artificial filling of animals will be permitted.

# Swine

## No Snaring of Hogs will be permitted on the Fair Grounds

**PQA Certification:** All gilt and barrow exhibitors are strongly encouraged to complete Youth Pork Quality Assurance (PQA) certification

**Gilts may be shown as market hogs but not as market and breeding both.**

## Market Hogs

**Ownership:** Exhibitor may show three Market hogs. Each Market hog must have been continuously owned and cared for by the exhibitor from the time of nomination through the conclusion of the premium auction

**Classification:** Papers are not required; however, all market hogs showing in a breed will require ear notches in both ears. Any animal not meeting breed characteristics will be moved to the crossbred class by the superintendent. All decisions are final.

**Show Weight:** Show weight will range from a minimum 190 to 280 pounds maximum.

**Grooming:** Clipping is allowed in the barns; however, no snaring will be allowed.

## Breeding Hogs

**Ownership:** Exhibitor may show three breeding gilts. Each breeding gilt must have been continuously owned and cared for by the exhibitor from the time of nomination through the conclusion of the premium auction.

**Weight:** All commercial gilts must weigh a minimum of 190 pounds to 340 pounds maximum.

**Notches:** All purebred gilts must have healed ear notches on both ears.

**Classification:** Purebred gilts will require registration papers and will show based on the breeds designated in the 2023 OYE rules. Class breaks will be determined at the show and age differences will be held to a minimum. Purebred gilts must be born between 7/1/21 – 10/31/21. Nonregistered gilts will show as commercial/cross by weight.

## SCCA County Bred Steers

**Ownership:** Only steers weighed in during the 2022 Seminole Co Fall Fair as participants will be allowed to participate in the SCCA Co Bred Class.

**Classification:** All steers will be shown together as one group, with classes broken at natural weight breaks if needed.

**Grooming and Fitting:** The SCCA steer show portion off the SCJLS will be BLOW AND SHOW ONLY. All SCCA steers are also eligible to participate in the SCJLS Jr Market Steer Show if properly nominated to the SCJLS.

Nomination into the SCJLS will also qualify as entry into the SCCA Co Bred Steer show, no additional entry fee will be charged.

Lineup of all steers top to bottom is for show ring ranking only in the SCCA co bred steer show. SCJLS Jr Market steer line up will be used for premium sale order ranking.
- February 20<sup>th</sup>-24<sup>th</sup>:** Steers will be delivered to Country Home Meats in Edmond.  
(SCCA will assign specific dates at the show.)
- Monday, Feb 27<sup>th</sup>:** Viewing of carcass at Country Home Meats in Edmond Ok from  
3:00 – 5:00 PM
- Thursday, March 2<sup>nd</sup>:** Beef Auction – Reynolds Wellness Center

This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, hemp, or other similar substances externally and steroids or artificial filling internally.
- Breeds will be based off the 2023 OYE Rules.
- ***Must attach a photo of the exhibitor with show animal for nomination along with dated registration papers unless shown as market, cross or commercial.***
