

Three-step process to becoming a Certified 4-H Volunteer



NOTE: only completing step #1 does NOT make you a 4-H Volunteer, it's just the application.



Go to http://4h.zsuite.org to enroll. Please use a valid and accessible email address that you can receive email at for further instructions as stated below.





After enrolling, if you are new or had a lapse in being a certified volunteer, you will then receive an email (to the email you provided online when you enrolled) from Sterling Volunteers for your required background check. You may need to check your spam or junk box. This is not done yearly, but every few years as well.





After you are deemed eligible from step #2, you will receive an email (to the email you provided online when you enrolled) from your county OSU Extension with instructions on how to complete the required Working with Minors and Title VII&IX Trainings. You are also notified whether you have been approved or denied.



4-H volunteers have been positive role models who have the best interest of the youth and the 4-H program as their primary focus. However, we must realize that people, families, 4-H members, and most importantly, society has changed.
