

On August 19, Hannah kicked off the Fall Small Acreage series with class #1, Beginner/Small-Scale Farmers and Ranchers resources with special guest speaker Josh Campbell who is the OSU State Extension Specialist for Beginning

Farmers and Ranchers. He shared with participants where to start in an agricultural endeavor, what resources of knowledge are available to them, grants/funding/ ag lending available to them, and things to consider when getting started. During the program, Hannah and Josh spent time with each participant to see what their goals were, what type of operation they had/ wanted to have, and give recommendations specifically for them. The rest of the series will be happening in August, September, and October with topics including Backyard chickens, Composting, Canning Apple Butter, sourdough bread workshop, and medicinal herbs. This program is a collaboration between educators in our office from agriculture, horticulture, and family consumer sciences. From the success of the spring small acreage class earlier this year, the fall series was a way to continue to offer educational programs to meet the needs of our county. Series in Tulsa County came about. At our office, we were receiving many calls asking about container gardening, small acreage farming, homesteading, and how large of a piece of land someone would have to buy to produce local food for their family. In the spring, we stared the series offering courses on resources for beginner/small farms and ranches, gardening, water bath canning, pressure canning, and cattle production on small acreages. Our program was successful, participants found it helpful, and we decided to continue the program twice a year. Through the spring participants' evaluation of the program, we discovered a new set of topics that would help meet those needs.

TULSA COUNTY EXTENSION

The OSU Strong Dads program recognizes the challenges that many men face in parenting, including financial pressures, societal expectations, and the need to adapt to new roles. Historically, support for fathers has been lacking, but this



program aims to change that by offering education, coaching, and various support services to fathers in the Tulsa County area. The program provides classes in both English and Spanish, helping fathers develop the skills they need to thrive in their roles.

To date, Strong Dads of Tulsa County has graduated many fathers, and the program is committed to continuing its mission of serving these men and their families. Starting on September 9, Strong Dads Field Coordinator Lacey McCause will host an English class at the Tulsa Central Library, while Bilingual Field Coordinator Maritza Martinez will begin a Spanish taught class on August 27 at Martin Regional Library. The program's outreach and support play a crucial role in empowering fathers and strengthening families in the community.

Field Coordinator Lacey McCause also extends her expertise to teaching within a facility in the Oklahoma Department of Corrections. Reflecting on her experiences, she notes, "Prisons are made of stone and metal, and you're not supposed to have a whole lot of feelings, but these men are still desperate to be with their children., the Strong Dads class provides a rare opportunity for incarcerated fathers to open up and be vulnerable, regardless of their backgrounds. Through this program, they learn from each other and build a supportive community, fostering a sense of connection and growth that transcends the barriers of their environment". Lacey



has received feedback from staff within the prison who have noticed a positive impact on the men who have participated in the Strong Dads program. One officer observed a noticeable difference in the way these graduates interact with their children and families during visits. This feedback highlights the effectiveness of the program in fostering stronger relationships and emotional growth among the fathers, even within the challenging environment of a correctional facility.
