




























We now have donated over 11,000 pounds of produce area food banks this year with still more to come!

AGRICULTURE


Tulsa County 4-H just wrapped up the Tulsa State Fair with fun and success! Our members have put in countless hours of hard work, feeding, washing, walking, exercising, and caring for their livestock projects. We had members



exhibiting rabbits, poultry, cattle, sheep, goats, and pigs. Not only are these livestock



projects fun for the kids, they also teach them countless valuable life skills such as work ethic, responsibility, accountability, record keeping, and finances to name a few.









At the start of each beginner/Small-Scale Farmers and Ranchers sequence dubbed the "Small Acreage Series" in Tulsa County, we begin with talking to beginner agriculturalists on how to start their operation, where to start, what resources are available to them (such as us at OSU Extension), and what assistance programs may be available to them. This specific class in the series has been so successful and in demand, that Ag Educator Hannah is partnering with Washington County OSU extension to offer "From the Start" Beginning Farm and Ranch Meeting: a deep dive on December 19th at the

Tulsa County office. This program will be an informational meeting with speakers from various agricultural entities, highlighting beginning farm and ranch startups, funding, and programming opportunities. This program will also be in partnership with local ag. Agencies such as: Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS), Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry (ODAFF), and the Farm service Agency (FSA).




OHCE Completed their 8th Annual Holiday

October was a month focused on education and networking, aimed at building new partnerships and strengthening existing ones. In addition to facilitating 3 English and 1 Spanish cohort, Tulsa County facilitations participated in the following:



On October 13, Tulsa County Bilingual Coordinator, Maritza Martinez attended the Festival de la Herencia Hispana. The event was aimed to

uplift the districts largest minority, showcasing Hispanic culture and traditions in a positive light.

From October 15-17, 2024 both Tulsa County coordinators for the Strong Dads program attended the Oklahoma Human Services Familyhood Statewide training in Oklahoma City. This event provided facilitators with valuable opportunities to deepen their knowledge and enhance the quality of services offered to participants in the fatherhood program. Sessions included topics such as "Empowering Families: The role of Tribal Nations in Oklahoma", "Strengthening Families through Faith-Based and Community Partnerships," "Serving Justice-Involved Families," Mastering Leadership, "Navigating Multiple Roles to Support Families,", Cultural Considerations and Strategies for Serving Diverse Families, and "Fatherhood and Cooperative Parenting." The training not only offered educational insights but also allowed for networking opportunities, which will support program growth and foster new partnerships.

On October 18, Strong Dads coordinator Lacey McCause attended the Wings of Freedom Gala. Wings of Freedom is widely recognized as one of the most successful sober living programs in the state, also providing support for individuals involved in the justice system. Some Strong Dads participants have also been part of this program, and Lacey hopes to continue strengthen this partnership.
