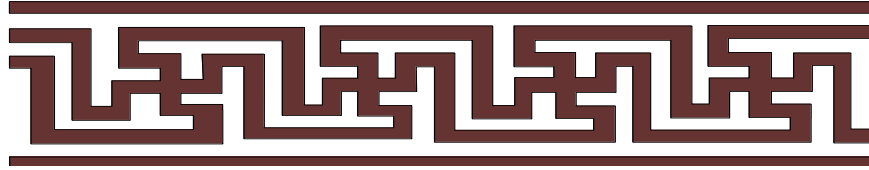
Tulsa County Spring Livestock Show

Show Ring Code of Ethics

Believing it is in the best interest of all breeders of all livestock to maintain a reputation of integrity and to continue to present a wholesome and progressive image in the show ring, the following list of practices or procedures is, therefore, considered a violation of the Rules and Regulations governing this show.

1. Misrepresenting the age of the animal or grade of the exhibitor for the class in which it is shown.
2. Treating or massaging any part of the body internally or externally with an irritant, counter irritant or other substance to temporarily straighten a weak back or loin or to produce unnatural animation.
3. Minimize the effects of crampiness by feeding or injecting drugs, depressants or applying packs or using any artificial contrivance or therapeutic treatment exempting normal exercise.
4. Striking the animal to cause swelling.
5. Surgery or any other procedure performed to change the natural process of growth, maturation, contour or appearance of any animal to include teeth is prohibited. Not included is removal of teats or horns, clipping and dressing of hair and trimming of hooves.
6. Insertion of foreign material under the skin.
7. Any attempt to change the natural color of an animal, either purebred or crossbred, by changing the color or adding false hair, fleece or skin at any point, spot or area of the animal's body.
8. The use of alcoholic beverages in feed or administered as a drench.
9. Administration of a drug of any kind or description, internally or externally, prior to entering the show ring, except for treating a recognized disease or injury. For the purpose of these rules, the term legal drug shall mean any substance by which the sale, possession or use of is controlled by license under federal, state or local laws or regulations and by any substance commonly used in the medical or veterinary professions. The use of any chemical and/or compound that is not approved by the Food and Drug Administration or the Environmental Protection Agency. A positive drug test will result in disqualification, forfeiture of any premiums and/or awards and will exclude the exhibitors from future livestock competition at the Tulsa County Spring Livestock Show. All medications will be administered by a licensed veterinarian only and with the species superintendent's approval.
10. The practice of artificial filling by internally pumping or any other device is prohibited.
11. **Criticizing or interfering with the judge, other exhibitors, breed representatives or show officials before, during or after the event may result in an individual or group being expelled, placed on probation, declared ineligible or barred from exhibiting at the event.**

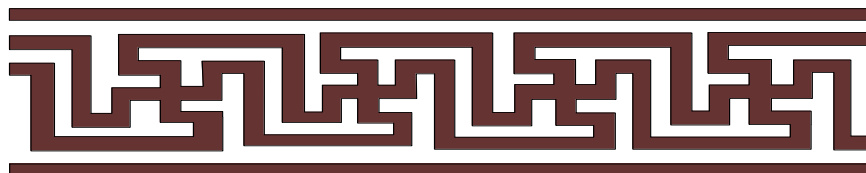
Any violation of the Rules and Regulations specifically designed for the individual shows or the Show Ring Code of Ethics may result in forfeiture of all premiums and awards and the disqualification, expulsion or probation of the exhibitor, organized group, or any individual, or livestock involved. Probation, disqualification, expulsion or other disciplinary action of the Management will be final. Such action will require application for readmission under such terms as the Management may prescribe before the group or individual is allowed to exhibit in future events.



**Behavioral Guidelines for Extension
Educators and Volunteers
Working with 4-H Youth Development Programs**

Oklahoma families and other youth service programs trust in the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service to provide educational programs in a safe environment for participating youth. Adults who assume Educator and volunteer roles within Extension have the opportunity for a rewarding experience. The opportunity to work with youth is a privileged position of trust that should be held only by those who are willing to demonstrate behaviors that fulfill the trust. The following behavioral expectations have been established for persons serving in Educator and volunteer roles within Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service programs.

1. Work cooperatively with youth, family, volunteers, Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service faculty and staff, and others in a courteous, respectful manner demonstrating behaviors appropriate for a positive role model for youth.
2. Represent the Cooperative Extension Service and the 4-H program with pride and dignity, behave appropriately, exhibit good sportsmanship, and demonstrate reasonable conflict management skills.
3. Respect, adhere to, and enforce the rules, policies and guidelines established by the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service including all state laws related to child abuse and substance abuse.
4. Recognize that verbal or physical abuse or committing criminal acts are grounds for termination as a volunteer or 4-H Youth Development Educator.
5. Comply with equal opportunity and anti-discrimination laws. Make all reasonable efforts to assure that 4-H youth programs are accessible to youth without regard to race, color, national origin, sex, religion, age or disability.
6. Treat animals humanely and encourage 4-H youth and adults to provide appropriate and ethical animal care.
7. Under no circumstances, allow or consume alcohol or illegal drugs at 4-H events or activities. Understand that the use of or being under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs while in the presence of 4-H members and/or at 4-H programs or activities is grounds for termination as a volunteer or 4-H Youth Development Educator.
8. The use of tobacco in the presence of 4-H members and/or during 4-H events is **strongly discouraged**, as the use of these products by minors is illegal.
9. Operate machinery, vehicles and other equipment in a safe and responsible manner when working with youth and adults participating in 4-H programs.
10. Accept responsibility to promote, conduct and support 4-H programs in order to develop an effective county, district, state and national 4-H program.



Rules and Regulations

1. All livestock and showmanship entries must be completed by the show's entry deadline.
2. All Exhibitors must be a member in good standing of a Tulsa County 4-H Club, or Tulsa County FFA Chapter for 60 days prior to the show in order to compete in the Spring Livestock Show.
3. Registration papers on breeding beef must be in the name of the exhibitor and be presented to the superintendent at the time of entry.
4. Exhibits must have been owned and fed by Tulsa County 4-H or FFA members by December 15, 2022.
5. **Except for an emergency, exhibitors will be required to show their own animal.** Examples of emergencies are: illness, significant personal or family accidents, etc. In the event of an emergency, permission must be obtained from the species superintendent and Extension personnel to allow another 4-H or FFA member to show for them. In the event the same exhibitor has two or more animals that are required to show at the same time, the owner-exhibitor can have a Bona fide 4-H or FFA member show the second or more animals for them without seeking committee approval.
6. All exhibitors must show their own animals in the showmanship contest.
7. Animals shown in showmanship contest must be officially entered in the 2023 Tulsa County Spring Livestock Show.
8. All youth who are 4-H or FFA members and entered in the 2023 Tulsa County Spring Livestock Show may enter showmanship
9. Health: Should the health of an animal be questioned, visual inspection will be made by the species superintendent or a veterinarian. Any animal not passing will be removed from the barn.
10. All animals must be checked in during the designated check-in times.
11. All animals requiring weigh-in must be weighed-in during designated weigh-in times. Failure to weigh-in during designating time will result in the animals' disqualification.
12. **All swine must have the original negative pseudo-rabies and Brucellosis test results form with ear tag in place as required by State Department of Agriculture. Premise ID will be required.**
13. **Poultry must have the valid original pullorum test results form at entry.**
14. **Exhibitors are limited to 3 entries per show. (example 3 market entries, and 3 breeding entries)**
15. Tulsa State Fair or Oklahoma Youth Expo apparel or the following guidelines.
Show Ring Dress Code: Exhibitors will wear one of the following:
4-H Member: A buttoned up, collared shirt or polo shirt, short or long sleeve, of the appropriate 4-H colors of solid green, solid white, or a mix of green and white. No third color mix or additional colors are allowed. Must have an official 4-H emblem of at least 2½ inches that is permanently affixed to the front, left side of the shirt, or **4-H members may wear official 4-H jacket or green jacket/pullover.**
FFA Member: A buttoned up, collared shirt or polo shirt, short or long sleeve, of the appropriate FFA colors of solid white, solid blue, solid yellow, or a mix of blue and yellow. No third color mix or additional colors are allowed. Must have an official FFA emblem of at least 2½ inches that is permanently affixed to the front and left side of the shirt, or **FFA members may wear their FFA jacket for the Spring Livestock Show.** Poultry and rabbit exhibitors will wear official apron when showing in 4-H or FFA jacket.
16. All exhibitors must be a member of a certified Tulsa County 4-H Club or FFA Chapter prior to December 28, 2022 to show.
17. Youth must be at least 8 years old and in the 3rd grade by September 1, 2022 and must not have graduated high school prior to the show date in order to participate in the Tulsa County Spring Livestock Show.
18. **Cages and stalls will only be provided for animals that are officially entered into the Tulsa County Junior Livestock shows.**
19. **The stalling of sheep, goats, or pigs on the trailer will be extremely limited and will be available on a first come, first served basis. Parking in fire lanes, in front of overhead doors and walk-through doors, and blocking other trailers/vehicles in will not be tolerated and may result in the towing of the trailer/vehicle at the owner's expense.**
20. Exhibitors must furnish feed and bedding. No straw is allowed for bedding.
21. Market animals may be purebred or crossbred. If necessary, a committee will determine breed classification.

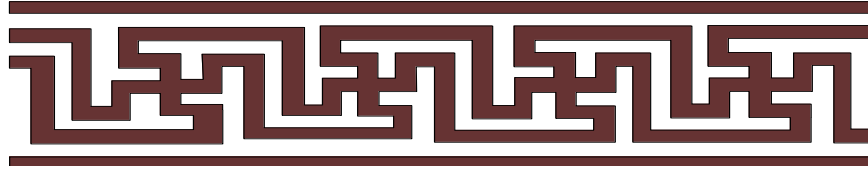
22. The Tulsa County Junior Livestock Show Committee shall have authority to settle questions which may arise concerning the show. Only the show committee is allowed in the show ring and scale area during weigh-in.
23. Decision of judge and superintendent is final. There will be no protest.
24. Failure to abide by the rules of the show shall cause forfeiture of all premiums and awards, and further participation in the Tulsa County Spring Livestock Show.
25. In no case shall the Tulsa County Junior Livestock Show Committee or Tulsa County Public Facilities Authority be responsible for any loss, damage, or disability.
26. Exhibitors in the Rabbit Division must remove their animals from the cage and place on the judging table. Should a substitute showman be necessary, in case of emergency, the substitute must be an official 4-H or FFA member. **Adults are not permitted to show the junior members animals.**
27. **A nomination fee from each group will be required. The nomination fee will be \$50 per head up to 5 head shown, \$400 6-20 head shown, and \$750 for 21 or more head shown. This fee will go towards purchasing awards and paying the Grand and Reserve Grand animal in each species. This money is due on February 10, 2023 with entries.**
28. The Tulsa County Junior Livestock Show Committee reserves the right to adjust premium amounts due to availability of amount budgeted for Spring Livestock Show.
29. This is a youth and family event. Responsible conduct is expected and required at all times. Profanity or any other offensive language, abusive conduct or act by an exhibitor, Extension Educator, Vo-Ag Educator, parent, or 4-H leader will be considered a violation of the Show Ring Code of Ethics and will be subject to the penalties outlined in the Show Ring Code of Ethics. Abusive conduct is defined as, but not limited to; aggressively touching, verbally or physically threatening show officials and/or throwing objects in the presence of show officials.

COVID-19 Health Precautions

To ensure we have a successful and healthy 2023 Tulsa County Spring Livestock Show, the following precautions will be in place and is **recommended** that each person in attendance adhere to items listed below:

1. Each person in attendance must strive to follow the Centers for Disease Control guidelines for physical distancing. This includes, but is not limited to, maintaining a distance of six feet from others.
2. The opportunity to stall livestock will be available in the Bronco Barn if needed. The parking of trailers for these three species near the barn's entrances will be limited. No overhead doors or exits can be blocked by any vehicle or trailer. The show site will provide cattle with a tie-up area either in the Bronco Barn or in the Super Duty Barn directly to the west.
3. A maximum of 2 people per exhibitor will be allowed around the show ring and inside the holding pen/make-ready area.
4. The Bronco Barn wash rack will be open, but show management encourages exhibitors to wash their animals prior to arrival.
5. Animal weights and/or date of birth will be collected during the check-in of each species.

ENTER AT YOUR OWN RISK - By entering the premises, you are acknowledging that an inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public place where people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. By attending the 2023 Tulsa County Spring Livestock Show, you and any guests voluntarily assume all risks related to exposure to COVID-19 and agree not to hold the Tulsa County Agricultural Education Teachers, or any of their affiliates or volunteers liable for any illness or injury.



Bonus/Premium Lineup (Swine, Goats, Sheep, & Cattle)

Starting in 2023, the swine, goat, sheep, and cattle shows will have an increased entry price of \$20.00 per head to facilitate a bonus/premium lineup (similar to a county premium sale) and a restructuring of earnings to animals placing above the reserve breed champion level. The original \$10.00 entry portion will be paid out in class (similar to past years). The remaining \$10.00 will go into a show-level payout program to help increase monies earned by exhibitors within that individual show. The following shows will be impacted by this lineup:

Within the shows above, the judge will be asked to select the top 10% of the animals in their preferred order. Each of the selected exhibitors will receive a portion of the money set aside for that show. The money set aside for each show will consist of \$10.00 from each entry fee, nomination money from each FFA chapter/4-H club, and donations from area businesses/organizations. Allocation amounts will be determined following the deduction of expenses for the Spring Livestock Show (i.e. judges, awards, etc).

The following payout schedule will be used. Exact amount received by each exhibitor will be based on number of head entered in their specific show and the payout schedule below:

- Grand Champions - 20%**
- Reserve Grand Champions - 15%**
- Breed Champions - equally divided share of 30%**
- Reserve Breed Champions - equally divided share of 15%**
- Animals selected for top 10% lineup within their individual show - equal share of 20%**

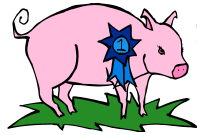
Notes:

Grands, Reserve Grands, Breed Champions, and Reserve Breed champions will be eligible for the top 10% lineup money.

Each exhibitor may receive money **once** within the portion set aside for the top 10% lineup (i.e. only one breeding gilt per exhibitor can be selected for the breeding gilt top 10% lineup)

Tulsa County Junior Livestock Show Committee has the right to adjust or amend any portion of this payout schedule at any point.

Market Swine Rules

1. All swine must have 840 tag and original test papers as required by State Department of Agriculture. Premise IDs will be required.
2. All swine must be fed, owned and cared for by exhibitor by December 15, 2022.
3. Two (2) animals of a breed and two or more owners from two or more households are required to constitute a breed; **otherwise, they will be shown in the crossbred class.**
4. The Swine Division Superintendent will be responsible for determining class size, swine weigh-in and classification.
5. Pigs will be weighed one time to determine official weight. **Maximum weight for market swine is 290 pounds.**
6. Gilts or barrows may be shown in the market show. Any gilt weighing more than the 290 pound maximum **must** be shown in the breeding gilt show. Gilts under 290 may not be shown in both market and breeding shows, the exhibitor must choose between market and breeding.
7. All swine must be free of contagious disease. Swine determined to be infected with a contagious disease, will not be allowed to show and must be removed from the barn.
8. All market swine will show by breed in alphabetical order with crossbreds last.

Breeding Gilt Show

1. All swine must have 840 tag and original test papers as required by State Department of Agriculture. Premise IDs will be required.
2. All swine must be fed, owned and cared for by exhibitor by December 15, 2022.
3. Two (2) animals of a breed and two or more owners from two or more households are required to constitute a breed; **otherwise, they will be shown as AOB.**
4. Gilts shown in purebred classes must be registered in the name of the exhibitor. Maximum weight for Commercial gilts is 340 pounds.
5. All gilts must be free of contagious disease. Gilts determined to be infected with a contagious disease, will not be allowed to show and must be removed from the barn.
6. Purebred gilts will be shown by age. Purebred Gilts must be farrowed between July 1, 2022 and October 31, 2022.
7. Registration papers required for Bred and Owned class. Bred and Owned class will occur after the champion drive.
8. The Swine Division Superintendent will be responsible for determining class size, swine weigh-in and classification.

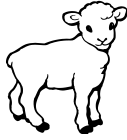

2. Registered ewes will be shown by age and will be verified (via registration papers) during check-in. Commercial ewes will be shown by weight.
3. All lambs must be free of contagious disease. Lambs determined to be infected with a contagious disease, will not be allowed to show and must be removed from the barn.
4. Ewes may be shown as market or breeding, but not both.
5. Two (2) animals of a breed and two or more owners from two or more households are required to constitute a breed; **otherwise they will be shown as an AOB.**
6. Registration papers required for Bred and Owned class. Bred and Owned class will occur after the champion drive.

Heifer Rules

1. Present registration papers at time of entry
2. Tattoos must be in the ear of the heifer and may be checked by Beef superintendent or his/her representative at check-in.
3. Registered heifers must be registered in owners' name by January 20, 2023. All heifers need to be owned, fed and cared for by the exhibitor by December 15, 2022.
4. No fitting will be allowed at the Tulsa County Spring Livestock Show. This includes adhesives and paint.
5. Heifers must be born between January 1, 2021 and August 31, 2022 to be eligible to show. Calves born after January 1, 2023, whose dam is a Registered Female being shown at the show, can be shown alongside their dam, **with Superintendent approval**. Commercial heifer pairs will not be shown.
6. Classes will be broken by superintendent
7. Registered breeds will be determined at the show. Two (2) animals of a breed and two or more owners from two or more households are required to constitute a breed; **otherwise, they will be shown as AOB and must be weighed.**
9. Commercial heifer classes will be broken by weight.
10. Heifers can be shown as Registered or Commercial Heifers but **NOT** both
11. There is no weight limit and no papers required for commercial heifers
12. All heifers must be free of contagious disease. Heifers determined to be infected with a contagious disease, will not be allowed to show and must be removed from the barn.
13. Registration papers required for Bred and Owned class. Bred and Owned class will occur after the champion drive.

Bred and Owned

Bred and owned must be registered in exhibitors name and papers must show exhibitor owned the dam when she was bred.

Steer Rules

9. All steers must be owned and fed by exhibitor by December 15, 2022.
10. Must have a full set of baby teeth with no signs of permanent teeth.
11. Beef Division Superintendent will weigh and divide steers into classes.
12. **Market steers will be divided into two classes** - Prospect and Progress. Prospect Steers will weigh 999 pounds or less, while progress steers will weigh 1,000 pounds or more.
13. All steers must be free of contagious disease. Steers determined to be infected with a contagious disease, will not be allowed to show and must be removed from the barn.

1. All birds must be in place by Wednesday, March 1, 2023 between 12:00 pm and 12:30 pm.
2. Entries are due February 10, 2023 to the Tulsa County 4-H Office.
3. Entries will be in one of the following categories:
Large Fowl, Bantams, Turkeys, Heavy Ducks, Medium Ducks, Light Ducks, Bantam Ducks, Heavy Geese, Medium Geese, and Light Geese
4. Sub classes in each breed will be:
Cock (C) - A male 12 months or older
Hen (H) - A female 12 months or older
Cockerel (K) - A male under 12 months
Pullet (P) - A female under 12 months
5. All varieties will be judged according to the latest edition of the American Standard of Perfection, copyrighted by the American Poultry Association, Inc.
Due allowance will be made for lack of plumage because of season.
6. All poultry will be physically inspected for disease and parasites by the superintendent at check-in. All ill or infested birds will be disqualified. Papers for a negative pullorum test must be presented at time of pre-entry and the original must be presented at check-in. Entries not accompanied by pullorum papers will not be entered. All birds must be tested before they come on the grounds. There will not be a tester at the show. All state issued pullorum papers expire within 90 days, unless issued an NPIP 1-year clean flock certificate.
7. All birds must be identified by a numbered leg band. Band numbers must be listed on the registration form. Birds that have no listed band numbers will not be registered.
8. Exhibitors are required to enter correct leg band numbers, proper color, sex and age of bird on entry form.
9. Exhibitors must have owned and cared for their birds by December 15, 2022.
10. Exhibitors must be present during the show unless showing other livestock with prior authorization from the show superintendent. Non-compliant exhibitors will be disqualified.
11. Exhibitors must cage and care for their own birds. Birds not caged by or cared for by their owners will be disqualified, unless cleared by superintendent.
12. There must be at least three birds to constitute a class. Otherwise, they will be shown in the "All Other" class. The show superintendent may combine classes at their discretion.
13. **Birds that are not pre-entered by the due date will not be admitted under any circumstances.**

Rabbit Division Rules

1. All rabbits must be pre-entered by February 10, 2023. Forms are available on-line or online entries can be done at the Tulsa County 4-H office.
2. All rabbits must arrive Wednesday, March 1, 2023 between 12:00 and 12:30 pm, and remain until released at the conclusion of the show.
3. No crossbred rabbits may be shown.
4. Show order and individual Breed classes will be determined by Show Superintendent and posted at the show table.
A.) All animals must be identified by a permanent legible tattoo in the left ear. Legibility to be determined by judge. B.) All rabbits confined more than one to a cage will be removed from the premises if the Rabbit Superintendent(s) deems one of the rabbits infected with a contagious disease. Contagious diseases of rabbits include, but not limited to, Pasteruella (snuffles), Coccidiosis, Scurvy, Mange, Fleas, Mites, and Lice. Rabbits with non-infectious diseases such as: ear cancers, slobbers, (often coming from stress), pot belly, abscesses, hernias, split penis, blindness, malocclusion, or sore hocks are considered to be unhealthy and will be disqualified, but will not be required to leave the premises.
5. All rabbits must pass a health inspection by the superintendent at check-in, although no health papers or registration certificate will be needed.
6. Best of breed winners in each major breed will compete for Best of Show, 1st Reserve and 2nd Reserve. Rosettes to be awarded.
7. Exhibitors must be in the area of the show during the show unless showing other livestock and cleared by Show Superintendent or they will be disqualified.
8. **Exhibitors must take care of their own rabbits while at the show.**
9. **Exhibitors must have owned and cared for their rabbit for by December 15, 2022.**
10. There must be at least three rabbits and two owners in the breed to constitute a class. Otherwise, they will be shown as All Other Breeds (AOB).
11. **All other information must be filled out completely on entry form unless rabbit needs to be tattooed at check-in.**
12. **Rabbits not entered by pre-entry due date will NOT be admitted under any circumstances.**
13. Meat pen will consist of three (3) rabbits, all of the same type and variety and under ten (10) weeks of age. Judging will be based on meat type, condition, uniformity and fur.
