4-H News

Teen Leader Officer Elections (ages 12+ only) August 8th during the teen leader meeting

All Officer Roles: All officers must be able to attend at least <u>9 of the 12</u> <u>monthly meetings</u>. Failure to show up will revoke officer duties and call for an election of a new member to fill that place for the remainder of the year. If you cannot make a meeting, you must let your County Extension Educator know at least 1 week in advance. All officers must participate in at least 5 county wide events (event nights, workshops, county fair, outings, etc).

President – Presides over meetings, creates the agenda and leads in voting. The president must be willing to help lead events at the local or county levels when needed and help put together fundraisers as well as recruit new members.

Vice President – Presides over meetings in the absence of the President. Leads the 4-H ritual during meetings. Vice president is also responsible for making sure opinions and ideas of other members are heard and addressed at the meetings.

Secretary – Records minutes from the meetings including votes on money spending, workshops, etc. They are responsible for bringing the minutes from previous meetings and sharing them for approval. Secretary will read minutes aloud and the president will ask for a proposal to accept or the minutes followed by a vote of the crowd.

Treasurer – Responsible for keeping track of money spending and income for the club. Treasurer will report the standing amount each month to the club and assist in choosing how to spend that money as well as helping with fundraisers.

Reporter – Responsible for attending local and county wide events and taking photos to be shared with the educator to go into the end of year slideshow.

Recreational Leader(s) – Can be an individual or can be a team of 2. Responsible for having an activity at the end of each meeting. Activity can be a craft, game, or other educational activity. Rec Leaders are responsible for letting the county educator know what activity they have planned in order for proper preparations.

Wagoner County Fair


August 30th – September 2nd

If you are interested in running for a NED Officer, You must attend one of the "potential candidate" workshops at the NED OSU Extension Office in Muskogee. August 9th @ 6pm or August 28th @ 6pm. Offices include President, Vice President, Secretary, Reporter, and Recreation Leader.

Candidates can have either ONE 22"X28" or TWO 14"X22" Posters.

Speeches must not be longer than 3 minutes.

Social media campaigning is allowed as long as there is no negative campaigning or defamation of character about another candidate.

This Year YIA is hosting a Voice Contest. There will be an extra entry form that will be due along with regular registration as well as submit a video to <u>ned-reports@okstate.edu</u>. Only 10 talents will be chosen to perform at YIA. Talents will be voted on by a panel who will select the top 3. Delegates will vote between the top 3 by placing loose change in their favorite contestant's jar to go toward the Change for Change service project.

Delegates also have the opportunity to sign up for any of these 4 Sports Tournaments; Volleyball (6 person teams), Basketball (3 on 3), Horseshoes, and Corn Hole. There will also be Skill-A-Thons set up at the same time.
