Entries accepted Wednesday, August 28 from 12:00pm (Noon) to 7pm AND Thursday, August 29 from 8:00pm to 12:00pm (Noon). All Baked Goods MUST be Pre-entered by NOON, August 29, 2024

NO LATE ENTRIES allowed. ONLY Pre-entered Baked Goods received Friday, August 30, until 9:30am.

Saturday, August 31, viewing Indoor exhibits will be from 8-10am. All exhibits MUST REMAIN on display until posted release times

Open/OHCE will be released from 10-11am. 4-H/FFA exhibits will be released from 11am-12pm (or 30 min after final livestock show on Saturday, whichever time comes first). Indoor Superintendents will be managing release of exhibits, so allow extra time.
