The emblem is a circle suggesting the continuity of life in our state, our homes, and our community education. The single candle symbolizes the unity of goals and purposes of our organization. The candle emphasizes the saying "it is better to light just one little candle and through unity light the world." The edge of the seal has 77 bites of light between the cogs representing all the counties of Oklahoma. This all forms a work wheel that our members have put their shoulders against and thus turns our world into a better society. Standing behind the candle is our great state of Oklahoma.

The meaning of the emblem was the deciding factor in the committee's selection of the design. It was submitted by Betty Auld of Grady County OHCE.

The emblem was amended to include "Est. 1935" in 2010.

Rules for State Conference

1. Sessions will begin promptly at the time announced.
2. Accredited voting delegates will occupy seats together in the designated area.
3. A voting delegate wishing to speak shall stand, address the chair, and when recognized may speak, first giving his/her name and county.
4. A non-voting member wishing to speak shall write comments/questions on note cards supplied by the District Representatives and give completed cards to his/her voting delegates.
5. All motions, as soon as made, shall be presented to the presiding officer, clearly written, and signed by the maker and seconder of the motion.
6. Debate shall be limited to two minutes per speech. No one may speak twice on a subject while others are desiring to speak, and no one may speak more than twice on a subject.
7. Debate on each question shall be limited to ten minutes unless it is extended by approval of the voting assembly by majority vote. Debate must be germane to the subject.
8. The results of a ballot vote shall be delivered directly to the secretary by the chairman of the election committee.
9. These conference rules shall be adopted, suspended, or rescinded by a two-thirds vote of the voting delegates present.
