Monarch Population Joins List of Endangered Species

Planting milkweed and nectar plants has slowed the decline of monarch butterflies in recent years.

There are over two dozen species of milkweed, Asclepias species, that grow in Oklahoma. The common milkweed, Asclepias syriaca, is an aggressive spreader, so special consideration needs to be taken when choosing a site to plant it. Check out these helpful tips for growing milkweed:

- Plant in pots, flower beds or a separate bed.
- Sow seeds directly into the garden soil and cover with 1/4 inch of soil in the fall in full sun with ample space.
- Plant transplants in blocks 18 to 24 inches apart
- Water regularly but avoid overwatering. Also avoid insecticides and herbicides around milkweed.


Wildlife Food Plot Meeting



Soraya was at the Tulsa County Free Fair to help youth learn about sugar in their drinks and to take a little time for a quick physical activity break with our fitness dice.



We decided to focus on food resource management with our community resource events this past month and show how you could have quick dessert to serve 12 that costs just under \$2.50.

3-Ingredient Apple Dump Cake Servings: 12

Ingredients:

4 cups chopped apples 1 box of yellow cake mix 12-oz lemon-lime flavored soda



Heat oven to 350°F. Spray 13x9-inch pan with cooking spray. Spread apples evenly on the bottom of the pan. Top with dry cake mix; gently shake the pan to distribute evenly. Pour lemon-lime flavored soda over top, tilting the pan to cover as much of the top as possible. Bake 45 to 50 minutes or until light golden brown, mostly dry on top and bubbly around edges.

TIP

Make sure to spread out the cake mix so there are no large mounds on top of the cake.
