












"From Wild to Mild".......

We are having the best adventures throughout Tulsa County this summer presenting our KIK It Up and Teen Cuisine classes at Reed Park, Owen Park, and the Salvation Army Boys & Girls Clubs. Fresh Start classes at the Women and Children Center, the Plaza Santa Cecilia, and the Tulsa County Extension Office. Outside of the classes we present, we continue to be present at Food On The Move Tulsa Community Resource Festivals celebrating and providing healthy food suggestions for produce. At the events this month we shared cucumber chips. If you enjoy snacking on

potato chips, we encourage you to try our recipe below for a healthier option.

Cucumber Chips

Servings: 8

Ingredients:

1-2 Large cucumbers 1 teaspoon of onion powder 1 teaspoon of garlic powder Salt to taste (optional)



Slice cucumbers thinly, about 1/8 of an inch in thickness. Pat cucumbers



dry and add them to a bowl. Mix well with your seasoning of choice. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Place the cucumbers onto the baking sheet, lying flat and separated. Bake low and slow at 170 degrees Fahrenheit for 3-4 hours. Time will depend on how large your cucumbers are. Remove the cucumbers from the oven once they are dried out and crispy.

Other seasoning options:

Smokey Cucumber Chips: 1 teaspoon of smoked paprika; 1 teaspoon of garlic powder; Salt to Taste

Salt and Vinegar: 1 teaspoon of apple cider vinegar; Salt to taste

Lemon and Pepper: 1 teaspoon of fresh lemon juice; ½ teaspoon of ground black

pepper
