





As summer is coming to a close Tulsa County Community Nutrition Education Programs focused our community food demonstration events around healthy snacks to help give ideas on using up those large harvests of cucumbers that sometimes we are looking for something different to enjoy. This is a tasty hydrating salad that not only tastes great but also smells wonderful!



A Simple Mexican Salad

Servings: 4

Ingredients:

- 2 cucumbers
- 2 oranges
- 1 lemon or lime (the juice-approximately 4 tablespoons)
- 1/2 teaspoon chili powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

Wash hands with soap and water. Wash the cucumbers, oranges and lemon or lime under cold running water. Slice the cucumbers. Peel and cut the oranges into small pieces. Place cucumber slices and orange pieces in a medium size bowl. Add chili powder, lemon or lime juice and salt. Serve and enjoy.
