 - Some data were only available since 1989

- Transition from "old line" packers to more varied leaders
- Noted effect from industry consolidation among the largest firms





- Evidence of responding to consumer demands

















Comparison of Top-Ranked and Bottom-Ranked Firms


- Similar trends (not surprisingly)

 - Recall that even the 50th ranked firm is quite large

















Comparison of Industry Leaders: Beef, Poultry, Pork


- Prior to Tyson Foods IBP merger

- Further evidence of further processing trend in beef and pork














Conclusions
