



2022 OHCE BY-LAWS COMMITTE

The OHCE By-Laws Committee is proposing a change for our By-Laws to be voted on at the state meeting in July 2022. Each county president should bring this change to their voting delegates at their council meeting to be approved. To be in compliance with OSU and the federal government each county should make this change in their county by-laws. Several by-law changes were made at the state OHCE meeting in July 2021. The state committee urges each county By-Laws Committee meet to see if their by-laws are in compliance with the state by-laws. If not, it would be the time to bring them up to date and approved by your county delegates.

Article III - Membership

SECTION 1. The membership of the Oklahoma Home and Community Education, Incorporated, shall consist of all county organizations for Home and Community Education whose membership support and advance its objectives and whose bylaws do not conflict with those of the parent organization. The Oklahoma Home and Community Education, Incorporated does not discriminate by gender, race, color, age, disability, religion, national origin, economic circumstance or status as a veteran in any of its policies, practices or procedures.

Proposed Change:

SECTION 1. The membership of the Oklahoma Home and Community Education, Incorporated, shall consist of all county organizations for Home and Community Education whose membership support and advance its objectives and whose bylaws do not conflict with those of the parent organization. The Oklahoma Home and Community Education, Incorporated does not discriminate based on *race, religion, age, sex, color, national origin, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity/expression, disability, or veteran status in any of its policies, practices or procedures.*
